Mrs. Arthur McGee, Dunsmuir's co-chairman of civil defense, then spoke on the need of awareness, preparation and training for warfare or other disasters. She said women have an obligation to learn to care for the injured, burned, aged, helpless, infants and panic stricken, and asked that those present call the city hall and volunteer for civil defense duties.

Mrs. Reg Thom, ways and means chairman, announced the club has raised \$460 in the mystery box project. Boxes of Christmas presents were won by Mrs. Pearl Ashby and Mrs. Tom Campbell.

The money represents the club project funds. The club voted to spend \$1 per member for the school kits or children of Hong Kong, a California Federation of Women's clubs project; spend \$10 for the Penny Pines reforestation project, and allocate \$400 toward the American Field Service foreign student program, stipulating \$200 go towards Dunsmuir's hosting Dieter Heinrich this winter and \$200 toward sending a Dunsmuir High School student to Europe next summer.

Four elementary school students, David Leighton, Walter Tausch, Mike Wright and Gene Landoe presented this musical medley. Santa Claus then appeared and passed out presents. Members also brought presents for the Ventura School for Girls.
