Some Tips For Male Shoppers
If you're planning to buy that girl a gift of jewelry for Christmas, better beware of bumpkin traps.
It seems there are many ways to be fooled in buying costume jewelry. Here are some pointers offered by jewelry designer, Van Dell, who hopes to safeguard novice purchasers:
BEFUDDLING FACT
For many years, homemakers have known that the hotter the water, the cleaner the wash. Today, labels on new wash-and-wear garments recommend using warm water, 100 to 110 degrees, because hot water tends to set wrinkles. In new fabrics, warm water preserves the resin finishes and minimizes wrinkling.
In good jewelry gems are hand set in prongs, usually. Cheap jewelry has stones pasted in. Good costume jewelry is made of 14 karat gold or sterling silver or gold filled. Look for the hall marks which indicate the metal.
The better jewelry is made usually with imported rhinestones or crystals or from semi-precious stones such as jade, moss agate, rhodonite as in the now popular scarab bracelets.
It is always wise to choose the simpler design when in doubt, he says. The male purchaser may ask too if the piece carries a guarantee. Responsible jewelers usually offer unconditional guarantee. Then, if something goes wrong, the item may be replaced or repaired without cost.
