KLAMATH AGENCY—The first annual Christmas lighting contest in the Fort Klamath, Chiloquin, Klamath Agency, Sprague River, Beatty and Modoc Point areas is being sponsored by the Klamath Reservation Jaycees this year.

All outdoor residential lighting displays in the area will be automatically judged, if they are ready and lighted for the judging on Tuesday night, December 23.

Prizes of a \$50 savings bond, two \$25 bonds and \$10 cash will be donated by the Jaycees and Jaycees. The winner of this contest will be entered in the national General Electric contest.

School Board Holds Meet

McCLOUD—A meeting of the Siskiyou County Board of Education was held at the county courthouse in Yreka December 16.

The board approved a list of eight teachers' credentials; allocated not to exceed \$2,000 of forest reserve funds to Macdool School District for capital outlay; approved the appointment of Wayne Meraux as trustee of Mount Shasta Elementary School District to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Don Reed.

They voted to send Mrs. Edna Barr and Mrs. Esther Foulke as representatives at the January 26 meeting of the National School Board Association meeting in San Francisco.

Dr. Don Meamber, member of the Siskiyou Junior College Board, presented a detailed account of the plans and building program for the new college to be built at Weed. He explained that it would be less expensive to build a new structure than to repair the old Weed High School for college use and to meet the Field Act requirements.

A request for \$50,000 forest reserve funds to assist in the equipping of the college classrooms was presented to the county board. Board members asked that other school needs be determined prior to commitment of a full compliance to the request and an answer to be forthcoming.
