20,000 Aliens To Report New Locations

PORTLAND — James L. Turner, district director of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, estimated today that 20,000 aliens will report their address in Oregon in January under the Federal Alien Address Program.

Turner said that 19,583 aliens reported their address during January, 1958. The law requires all aliens in the United States, with few exceptions, to report their address during each January. Throughout the United States almost 30 per cent more applications for naturalization are received during January, February and March than are received during other months. The immigration official attributes this sudden rise to the Alien Address Program.

Aliens not required to make this report are diplomats, those accredited to certain international organizations and those who have entered temporarily as agricultural laborers.

Forms for making the reports will be available to aliens at all post offices and offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Portland during January.

Turner indicated that aliens desiring information concerning naturalization or similar matters should obtain the forms at an office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service where personnel trained in these fields will be available to answer inquiries.

Postage Rate May Reduce Student Mail

McCLOUD — Dr. Ken Young, director of curriculum for Siskiyou County schools, said Siskiyou students and teachers who prepared tape-slide units for use in Pakistan are now faced with the problem of preventing correspondence from becoming a financial burden on their new friends.

A score of letters have now been received in two envelopes, each requiring about 50 cents for air mail postage. This was paid by the American teacher in Pakistan. Pakistani students could not afford such expenditures for 50 cents might keep a family in food for several days.

American students can prevent this unfair burden by buying international reply coupons at large post offices for 13 cents, which can be redeemed in a foreign country for return postage. Two coupons can be used for an air mail letter. Air mail is preferred because it may take as long as two months for a ship transported letter or package to arrive. Such long waits dampen the ardor of young hopefuls and may nullify the desired results in international friendship.

Foreign correspondence exchange it was pointed out, provides students with first hand experiences in promoting international friendship, understanding of the problems faced in underprivileged nations.
