

\$15,000 Fire Hits School

EUGENE (AP)—A fire caused an estimated \$15,000 damage to the combination gym-auditorium of the three-story Woodrow Wilson Junior High School here Wednesday. Nobody was injured in the blaze.

It hit after school hours, but while faculty members were meeting in the main school building. The gym-auditorium is a separate wing of the brick structure.

Fire Marshal Lester Barker said the fire apparently started on the auditorium stage, but the cause was not learned.

Steven Hadley, 16-year-old son of the school's principal, George Hadley, spotted the fire from his home nearby. His mother called the fire department.

Fire Chief P. L. Smith said if the fire had gone unnoticed another five minutes it would have spread through the entire building.

Hadley said there was nobody in the burned wing, which was locked at the time the fire flared openly. Five pumper trucks and one ladder truck were rushed to the scene.

The building, built in 1914, was used as a high school until 1953, when it was converted to a junior high school.

Movie Group Spikes Plans

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences has spiked plans to mark showman Mike Todd's Chicago grave with a 9-foot-high Oscar.

"The Oscar is protected by copyright," said a spokesman for the academy. "All who receive it sign a receipt they and their heirs will respect this copyright." He said it could not be used to mark a grave.

Todd's brother, David Goldbogen, had said in Chicago he was planning to erect a two-ton marble statue over the grave. Todd won an Academy Award Oscar for his movie "Around the World in 80 Days." He died in a plane crash last March 21.

Goldbogen was not available for comment on the academy's statement, but his wife said she did not believe her husband knew of the copyright.

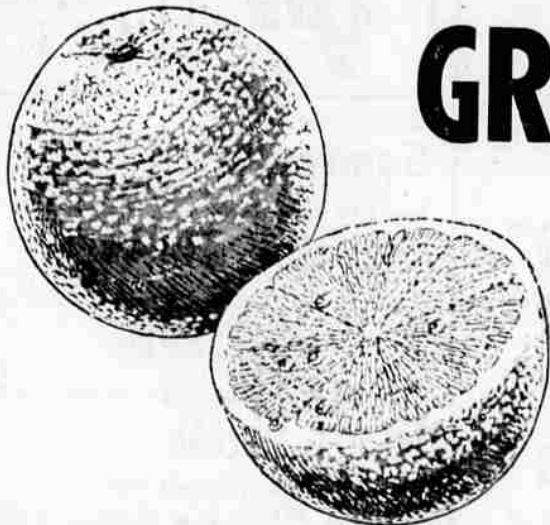
