Washington St. Tells Six-Year Grid Slate

PULLMAN (AP) — Washington State College Tuesday announced a six-year football schedule that will include 15 intercollegiate games ranging from Iowa to Army.

The announcement makes WSC the first school of the dissolved Pacific Coast Conference to publicly set forth an athletic program not committed to a league.

Athletic director Stan Bates said the overall schedule features 59 games. He said there is one "breather" weekend in 1959. The schedule, with two dates in 1964 yet to be filled, includes games with Idaho, Washington and Stanford each year.

"We are extremely happy with the overall aspects of the schedule," said Bates. "We believe we have the coaching resources to continue turning out good teams and that WSC will continue to be a school to attract top-ranking athletes."

Bates said athletic directors of the now dismantled Pacific Coast Conference are hopeful there "will be some sort of reforming of a league before 1964. If not, there is talk of the possible organization of an airplane league by then. This would involve travel all over the country—and with the great steps being taken daily in aviation."

Ray Bluth Leads Star Bowling Test

BUFFALO, N. Y. (AP) — Ray Bluth, star of the St. Louis Blues, leads a field of 94 men into the one-day semifinals of the All Star Bowling Championships today.

Bluth finished 24 games of qualifying action Tuesday with a 214 average and a total of 5148 in the four days. In his final six-game block, he rolled a series of 195-244-106-212-237-212—1286.

In second place was Lou Campi of Dumont, N.J., who had a 1273 series for a 24-game total of 5126. Billy Welu of the St. Louis Cardinals took third spot with 5107. Welu rolled a 1277 series Tuesday.

Walter Ward, Lakewood, Ohio, held fourth place with a 1291 series making his four-day total 5086. Ronnie Diamond of Dallas, Texas, beat Jack Fleck of New York City in a roll-off for 94th position. The two ended the regulation qualifying round tied at 4633.

The men will roll two six-game blocks today. Thursday the top 14, plus Don Carter and Buzz Fazio of St. Louis, 1958 champion and runner-up respectively, who are seeded into the finals, will roll.

In the women's event, Olga Gloor of Chicago easily topped the qualifiers with a 20-game total of 3959. The 38-year-old housewife rolled four-game series of 802 and 714.

Her nearest rival was Joan Holm, another Chicagoan, who had 3882 pins after tossing sets of 772 and 735.
