Other members of the board include former Sen. Herbert Lehman of New York; Paul G. Hoffman, Dr. Ralph J. Bunche, John R. Boettiger, Mrs. Eugenie Anderson and Anna Lord Strauss.

The association is affiliated with the World Federation of United Nations Associations. Mrs. Neuberger explained, and its program is devoted to attainment of world peace through the work of the United Nations organization. As a member of the board of directors.

Mrs. Neuberger will help determine policies to promote public knowledge and understanding of the United Nations.

Mrs. Neuberger has been invited to attend the meeting of the board scheduled for January 28 in New York City.

The Neuberger's have had a long interest in progress of the United Nations. While in Army service during World War II, Neuberger attended the 1945 UN charter conference in San Francisco as an official observer. Mrs. Neuberger
