NEW YORK (AP)—Two bandits got their just dessert Thursday. They grabbed a cardboard box thinking it was a \$3,000 payroll.

Mechanics Gaston Martens of Fort Lee, N.J., and James Rayster of Manhattan were just driving up to the Fifth Avenue Coach Co. garage with the payroll. En route from the bank they had picked up the pie.

They were accosted by two armed men. One thug slugged Rayster with a rubber hose. The other grabbed the box.

Police cruising the Henry Hudson Parkway spotted a car side-swiping several cars. They gave chase and captured Francis Romano, 26, and his brother, John, 23, both of the Bronx.

In the car, which police said was stolen, were a revolver, a pistol, and the pie. The brothers were booked on charges of assault, robbery and violation of the Sullivan (anti-weapons) law.

Union Paid Beck's Bills

TACOMA, Wash. (AP)—Testimony in the Dave Beck income tax evasion trial Thursday indicated the former Teamsters' Union chief charged the union for hotel bills despite travel expense allowances totaling \$22.30 a day.

A former secretary for Beck, Mrs. Ann Watkins Kotin of Los Angeles, testified Wednesday Beck often took union business trips which would keep him on the road as much as 25 days a month.

Thursday's testimony came after Joe McEvoy, a beer salesman, told the court he made \$40,000 on money loaned to him by Beck, whom he described as "like a second father" to him.

McEvoy, who once was hired as a bodyguard for Beck's family following a 1956 kidnap scare against Dave Beck Jr., said he borrowed \$35,000 from the ex-Teamsters boss in 1953.

McEvoy said he used the money to buy stock in a company which invested Teamsters' funds in real estate and in 1957 sold the stock for \$75,000.

Beck is charged with evasion of \$240,000 in income taxes during 1950-53.

Potato Stocks Show Increase

WASHINGTON (AP)—Oregon had more than four million hundredweight of potatoes on hand Jan. 1, helping push up the stocks of potatoes held by growers and local dealers nationally to 18 per cent above a year ago.

The agriculture department Thursday said stocks Jan. 1 were 106,800,000 hundredweight, compared with 90,600,000 a year ago.

That followed a month in which usage of potatoes was reported to have been the highest in 19 years.

Oregon had 4,150,000 hundredweight of potatoes on hand Jan. 1. Idaho had 24,500,000 hundredweight.

Britons Scoff Architecture

LONDON (UPI)—The Royal Academy of Arts and Anti-Ugly Society carried a coffin to the cornerstone laying ceremony of London's newest building Thursday to conduct a "funeral of British architecture."

"The city is ugly enough... This is architectural bankruptcy," said signs carried by the mourners—academy students who demand that plans for the building be scrapped.

The building is the eight-story Barclay's bank building in the city financial district. Like most London banks—and other buildings built in London in the past 100 years—it is solid, square and a stone.

Anti-Ugly chairman Brian Newman, 22, said the building was "typical of the horrible things that have been going on in the city."

Church Suit Set By Architect

PORTLAND (AP)—A New York architect has filed a U.S. District Court suit that said the First Presbyterian Church of Salem Inc. owes him fees for plans he drew for a new church.

James C. Mackenzie said in the Thursday suit the corporation owes him \$13,091, plus interest from December, 1957, for plans he drew.

Mackenzie said the corporation decided to move an already-constructed church to the building site rather than erect a new plant as previously intended.

Librarian Given State Position

SALEM (AP)—Constance H. Grier, librarian of the city library at University City, Mo., was appointed Thursday as assistant librarian of the Oregon State Library.

The appointment, effective Feb. 16, was made by State Librarian Eloise Ebert.

She received her training at Washington University and St. Louis Library School. She has been librarian at University City for 15 years.

Elgin Robber Sent To Jail

LA GRANDE, Ore. (AP)—A Lewiston, Idaho, man is going to the Oregon State Penitentiary—just 16 days after his release from the federal prison at McNeil Island, Wash.

Robert Lee Robinett, 33, Thursday was sentenced to 15 years in the state prison after pleading guilty to holding up an Elgin, Ore., service station Tuesday night.

Robinett fled in a stolen car after the holdup, only to abandon it after the state police shot out a headlight. About 12 hours after the robbery, state police apprehended Robinett in a stolen pickup truck.

Dist. Atty. George Anderson Jr. said FBI agents would not prosecute Robinett on stolen car charges.

Child Home With Parents

NEW YORK (AP)—Lisa Rose Chionchio, kidnaped from a Brooklyn hospital 2 1/2 hours after she was born on Jan. 2, is home with her happy parents.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Chionchio called at St. Peter's Hospital Thursday and took Lisa Rose, now 13 days old, home for keeps.

Earlier, the Chionchios were among 10 witnesses appearing before a grand jury hearing testimony in the case of Mrs. Jean Iavarone, 43, charged with taking the baby from its hospital crib.

Mrs. Iavarone was arrested last Sunday night in her Brooklyn apartment, where the baby was found in good health. The child was returned to the hospital for observation.

Queen Invited To Centennial

PORTLAND (AP)—Queen Elizabeth will be invited to help celebrate Oregon's 100th birthday anniversary this summer, the Oregon Centennial Commission said Thursday.

The queen and her husband, Prince Philip, will be invited to come here in June, after their appearance at the opening of the St. Lawrence Seaway.

Rocket Report Given By Soviet

LONDON (AP)—The Soviet cosmic rocket now has reached the closest point it will go to the sun's perihelion, Moscow radio said today.

The rocket was reported 90,000,560 miles from the sun, 372,840 miles closer to the sun than the earth is.

Group Announces Minimum Wage

SALEM (AP)—The state Wage and Hour Commission Thursday established a minimum wage of \$1 an hour for women and minors in factories.

The old minimum of 65 cents was established in 1948.

It brings the minimum to the same level as adopted by the federal government for industries in interstate commerce.

The commission also rules that time and a half pay must be paid for overtime after 8 hours a day. This replaces a provision that straight time should be paid.

Another part of the order places a limit of 30 pounds on objects lifted by women.

India, Yugoslavia Continue Policy

NEW DELHI (AP)—India and Yugoslavia will continue their policy of coexisting with all East-West blocs and joining none, Prime Minister Nehru and President Tito promised today.

The two leaders issued a joint statement at the end of a two-day visit to the Indian capital by the Yugoslav president.
