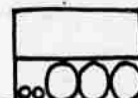

Let's Draw an Old Engine

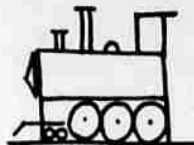

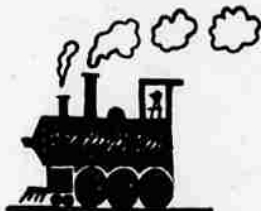
A box that we divide in two
