'Opry' Singer Coming Here

Country singer Faron Young, a favorite of the Grand Ole Opry radio and TV and a stage and recording artist, is coming to town. The handsome Louisianan combines his golden voice with some fancy guitar pickin' to be in the front rank of "folk" singers. He will appear at the Klamath Auditorium on the night of Friday, January 23.

Faron's local fans will hear him sing such favorites as "Goin' Steady," "I Can't Wait," "A Place for Girls Like You," "In a Chapel in the Moonlight," and "If You Ain't Lovin', Then You Ain't Livin'."

This big Grand Ole Opry show features, other than Faron, Teddy and Doyle, the Wilburn Brothers—famous Decca recording artists and stars in their own right—as well as singer-guitarist Jimmy Newman, and many others.

The show will last from 8 to 10 o'clock, with dancing from 10:30 to midnight. Tickets are now on sale at the Derby Music Company.

Leftists Snip Commie Ties

NAPLES, Italy (AP) — Pietro Nenni emerged in solid control of Italy's leftwing Socialists Sunday night as the party formally severed its longtime ties with the Communists.

The onetime Stalin peace prize winner, who has been pressing his party to break with the Reds since the 1956 Hungarian revolution, rammed his motion through the National Socialist Congress with 273,271 votes, or 58.30 per cent, behind it.

A motion by Nenni's rival, extreme leftist Tullio Vecchietti, to renew the Socialist alliance with the Reds polled only 153,060 votes or 32.85 per cent. A compromise motion by Lelio Basso got 40,933 votes, or 8.73 per cent.

The party also agreed to continue opposition to Premier Amintore Fanfani's Christian Democratic-led government.

The vote to break with the Communists also placed Nenni firmly in control of the party machinery. Seats on the 81-member Central Committee will be allotted on the basis of the votes for the different motions. A party official said Nenni's supporters will get 47 seats, Vecchietti's 27 and Basso's 7.

U.S. Observers Invited To See Cuba Executions

HAVANA Cuba (AP) — Fidel Castro said today he has invited 350 newsmen and commentators from the United States and Latin America to attend a giant rally called in Havana Wednesday to show support for his speedy trial and execution of Batista henchmen.

The revolutionary chief said he also had invited U.S. congressmen who "in recent days have severely criticized the executions of war criminals by the revolutionary army."

A statement from Castro's press headquarters said personal invitations had gone out to the foreign journalists. A spokesman said five planes would be sent to Miami to pick up those wishing to attend and another plane might go on to Washington.

Court Acquires Right-Of-Way

"We have extended the invitation," Castro's statement said, "so that the truth of what is happening in Cuba may be told to all citizens of every country in America. We believe that if the truth is known any misunderstanding that has occurred in recent days regarding the situation in our country will disappear."

Castro has called for a half million Havana residents to turn out Wednesday to back his regime's rejection of foreign criticism of the speedy execution of those convicted of killing opponents of ex-dictator Fulgencio Batista.

The auxiliary Roman Catholic bishop of Havana, Msgr. Alfredo Muller, Sunday night endorsed the executions, reported to have reached 207 throughout Cuba. Appearing on a television inter-

view with revolutionary chief Fidel Castro, Bishop Muller said he personally opposes capital punishment but that the church permits it in some instances.

"In this case it is justified," he declared. Although Castro avoided saying when the Havana trials would get under way, he said they would be conducted under a military code and open to the public.

"I want everyone to see clearly," he declared. Some 2,000 members of revolutionary groups gathered in Havana's Central Park last night, more reading: "Let the executions continue," Peraza Venegas, 24, a Castro soldier, pulled back his shirt to display scars he said had come from torture by Batista police.

Castro said in the TV interview that only military men will face the military tribunals, an indication civilians may go before the special revolutionary courts he has said will be set up. He also reduced his earlier estimate that 450 in all will be executed, saying not more than 400 will be put to death.

The rebel leader said that the trials cannot wait until civil courts are reestablished. If they are spread out over several months, "we will never have peace," he declared. He called for the United States to return top members of Batista's regime who fled north. "If the United States does what it says—what democratic principles demand—if the United States is decent and civilized, it cannot help war criminals," he said. There are some 650 prisoners awaiting trials in La Cabana fortress overlooking Havana Bay and some 3,000 to 6,000 under arrest in all Cuba.
