Pope To Run Church Like A Small Parish

VATICAN CITY (UPI) — Pope John XXIII plans to run the Roman Catholic Church and its nearly half-billion members as he would

a tiny parish but with the religious fervor of a leader bent on a world crusade.

The crusade of the 77-year-old Pope in 1959 will be for a spiritual revival in a world gone sick with cynicism and generally threatened by the materialistic doctrine of Communism.

Never since the days of the Roman persecutions has the Catholic Church faced such a tenacious, aggressive and brutal foe.

In fact, 75,000,000 of the Roman Catholic Church's 496,500,000 followers are already at the mercy of Communist regimes behind the Iron Curtain.

Other millions are threatened by this doctrine and, in the eyes of the church, weakened by a moral and spiritual decline which has worsened through the 20th century.

This is Pope John's major task — pastoral work in bringing back to the flock those who have strayed and winning new followers toward the "perfect goal" of "one flock, one shepherd."

Pope John does not intend to accomplish all this in his reign. He is the 21st successor to Peter, the first Pope. The church thinks in terms of centuries.

But the indications of the new Pope's immediate intentions and his own utterances are numerous enough to chart his pontificate in the new year.

Unlike his predecessor, the late Pius XII, the new pontiff delegates authority.

As in a small parish where one priest runs the school, another is custodian for the church, another the confessor and another the "outside man" for sick calls, so too can the broad functions of the Vatican and its adjuncts be delineated.

Pope John has given every indication he will run the Vatican like a small parish.

Within three weeks of his election on October 28, he:

Created 23 new cardinals from nine countries and brought the strength of the Sacred College, the "senate"—in an unprecedented 75 princes of the church. Heretofore, the College had a maximum of 70 cardinals, and rarely that many.

Appointed Domenico Tardini as Vatican Secretary of State, the first since 1944, and made him a cardinal. The late Pius XII preferred to act as his own state secretary, the job he had held under his predecessor.

Re-instituted daily conferences somewhat like "cabinet meetings" with chief of various Vatican and religious departments.

Advised his cardinals, bishops and priests to get down to work on their "first task—teaching the gospel."

There can be no compromise between the Church and Communism.

The Vatican, with its centuries-spanning viewpoint, feels confident that the word of God will triumph over the dictates of the Kremlin.

But this confidence is realistically predicated on the premise that Christians themselves will remain militant in resisting the Red threat. Pope John hopes to fortify that resistance.

Communism is the chief of many problems that Pope John faces in the new year.

There is also a dearth of missionaries and priests throughout the world. Not enough new ones are stepping forward to fill the gaps left by death and to handle the increased work offered by a mushrooming world population.

Pope John can be expected to vitalize the call for new priests and to encourage vocations in the young.

The ancient Vatican administration machinery needs reorganization and a meshing with modern times. This is part of the "parish church" theory, bringing the Mother Church closer to the parishioners themselves, invoking by warmth and understanding new confidence and respect.

Every affiliated Seventh-day Adventist Church throughout the world takes part in this annual campaign. Money solicited is used for medical service, educational and welfare work for the less fortunate. None goes for administrative costs.

The local church on December 27 reported as follows on the work accomplished by the welfare unit: garments given, 229; cash, \$719.39; food baskets, 22; hours of service by members of the church, 3,100; persons assisted, 648.

Translation Of Book Set

A Klamath Falls man, Ralph L. Foster, author of a religious manuscript, "Triumph in Christ," is having the book translated into the Greek language. The book was written for afflicted shut-ins and handicapped, and is being handled through the American Mission to Greeks, Inc., New York City.

Divinity Pupil Plans Sermon
John Louis Whitsell, Oakland, California, a junior student at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific (Episcopal), Berkeley, will preach at St. Paul's Episcopal Church on Sunday morning, January 25. The sermon will commemorate Theological Education Day for the Episcopal Church throughout the United States.

The Episcopal seminary of the Pacific area will join 10 others throughout the United States in making their annual appeal for funds on this date when parish offerings will be earmarked for furthering the training of future clergy.

Seminarians from this, the only Episcopal theological school in the west will preach in local parishes in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Arizona and California.
