Railroads See Better Year In 1959

NEW YORK (UPI) — The nation's railroads bumped along in 1958, but a smoother ride is in prospect for 1959.

The recession bit hard into the earnings of the Class I roads, dropping them to about \$550 million from \$734 million in 1957, the poorest showing since 1949. And the bite would have been bigger had it not been for a February rate hike and a \$58-million retroactive mail pay.

However, anticipated increases in traffic, coupled with continued tight cost control, should lift 1959 earnings above the deflated 1958 figures.

The railroads received some favorable legislation in 1958, but, according to Daniel P. Loomis, president of the Association of American Railroads, it was only "interim action" and the roads will press for further remedial action in the new Congress.

The provisions of the Transportation Act of 1958 include federal government guarantees of up to \$500 million of private loans to railroads, and authorization for the Interstate Commerce Commission to permit discontinuance of unprofitable trains and ferries where interstate service is provided.

Little was done, however, to restore the rail industry to equal competitive footing with its rivals, and depreciation allowances were not liberalized. The heart of the passenger problem was ignored, and the 10 per cent war-time levy on passenger travel was not eliminated.

The year 1959 may find fewer railroads on the scene. A merger fever has gripped the eastern roads which have finally realized there are too many lines competing for too little business.

The nation's two largest railroads—the Pennsylvania and the New York Central—have been actively discussing a marriage for about a year. An Erie-Lackawanna-Delaware & Hudson merger also has been studied for some time, and now the Norfolk & Western and the Virginian, five New England roads, and the Atlantic Coast Line and Seaboard Airline railroads all have started merger talks.

These lines could start a trend that some railroad men believe is the only solution to the railroad industry's problems. Some have said that the nation's 130 major railroads should be merged into six to ten major systems.

Meanwhile, the huge passenger deficit continues, and many roads are discontinuing lines and stations in an effort to reduce it. But there are some roads, particularly in the West, that are experimenting with means not only of keeping passengers but of increasing them. Slumber coaches, package meal-travel plans, off-day tours, and travel trays meals on coaches, among other things, all are getting try-outs.
