

Economy Budget Includes Pay Hike For UC Workers

SACRAMENTO (UPI)—A five per cent across the board pay increase for University of California employees and a \$43,325,189 slash in capital outlay were included today in Gov. Edmund G. Brown's economy budget.

The pay boost for university employees, along with other wage adjustments, would cost the state \$9,296,715 in the proposed \$168,688,533 University of California budget.

Capital outlay was cut some \$43,325,189 below last year's spending program, but finance officials say this is not bad since it still conforms with the state's five-year 214 million dollar university expansion program.

"This budget," the administration said, "is a continuation of the present level of service and provides generally for workload increases only."

Brown's spending program calls for \$142,761,378 to defray operating expenses. This is an \$11,960,000 increase over last year, but the major portion of this comes from the proposed wage increase. Only \$24,327,155 is slated for construction of new facilities at the eight campuses of UC:

Berkeley — \$7,061,400 including

\$1,676,000 to turn Stephens Union and Eshleman Hall into teaching and research buildings; \$1,616,500 to provide off-campus storage facilities.

Davis — \$2,312,290 including \$1,392,350 for classrooms for physical sciences.

La Jolla — \$290,000 including \$250,000 to expand the Scripps Institution of Oceanography.

Los Angeles — \$4,894,352 including \$1,944,672 for a new physical education and military science building.

Mt. Hamilton — \$92,000.

Riverside — \$1,624,218.

Santa Barbara — \$1,890,565.

San Francisco — \$430,300.
