Pat Requests Tax Boost To Balance New Budget

SACRAMENTO (UPI) — Gov. Edmund G. Brown asked the Legislature today to vote \$256,600,000 a year in new taxes to help balance the biggest spending program in the state's history.

Income tax payers, smokers, beer drinkers, horse race players, oil companies, banks, corporations and insurance companies would bear the brunt of the new tax proposals. The cost for each of the 15 million Californians would be \$17.10 a year.
