

Casserole

Now is the time to turn the tables on Old Man Winter. Good food, the warm atmosphere of informal hospitality and a gathering of friends and neighbors is a good way to go about it. Your next party might be planned as a "cook-in."

A "cook-in" is a picnic indoors. Actually, and can be staged with the utmost informality. Get out the chafing dishes. A Japanese hibachi, if you have one and have a fireplace grill if that works at your house. The hot coals are perfect for broiling little individual appetizers made by stringing half-inch cubes of beef and sausage in pieces (alternated) on skewers and letting the guests cook their own. A bowl of melted butter to

which a clove of garlic or some anchovy paste has been added makes a fine dunk for the tiny shish-ka-bobs.

Bring out your brightest, gayest picnic cloth and paper napkins. Use picnic dishes or wooden plates and bowls or the new coated Fonda bowls which will take hot foods. A big wooden tray of cubed cheeses, sliced red apples (leave on the skins), crackers and potato chips, carrot sticks and celery will be a fine accompaniment. Have individual salad molds if you wish or let your guests serve themselves from a big bowl of tossed salad, macaroni salad or potato salad. The fixing can be done in advance and keeps the hostess out of the kitchen at dinner time.

One hot dish such as tamale

pie, made especially good with big black ripe Wyandotte olives, or a casserole of beef-vegetable curry with a cheese baked corn bread topper, and a dessert completes the meal.

BEEF-VEGETABLE CURRY WITH CORN BREAD TOPPER (8 servings)

1 clove garlic chopped
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/4 cup (1/2 stick) melted butter
2 pounds boneless beef cut in 1/2 inch cubes
1 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 tablespoons curry powder
1 1/2 cups water
1/2 cup golden raisins
1 cup peeled, sliced apples
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
2 tablespoons flour
1 package frozen peas and carrots (unthawed)

Brown garlic and onion in melted butter. Remove vegetables and add meat to brown. Stir in seasonings, water, raisins, apples, Parmesan cheese, browned onions and garlic and simmer, covered, for at least 30 minutes or until meat is tender. Mix flour with water and add.

If you have gone this far using a skillet on top of the stove which you do not wish to put in the oven, then transfer mixture to a 2 or 2 1/2 quart casserole.

Sprinkle frozen peas and carrots over the meat mixture. Top with the Cheese Corn Bread batter and bake in a preheated oven, according to the directions on the box of corn meal or corn bread mix. When done, garnish with parsley and serve right from the skillet or casserole.

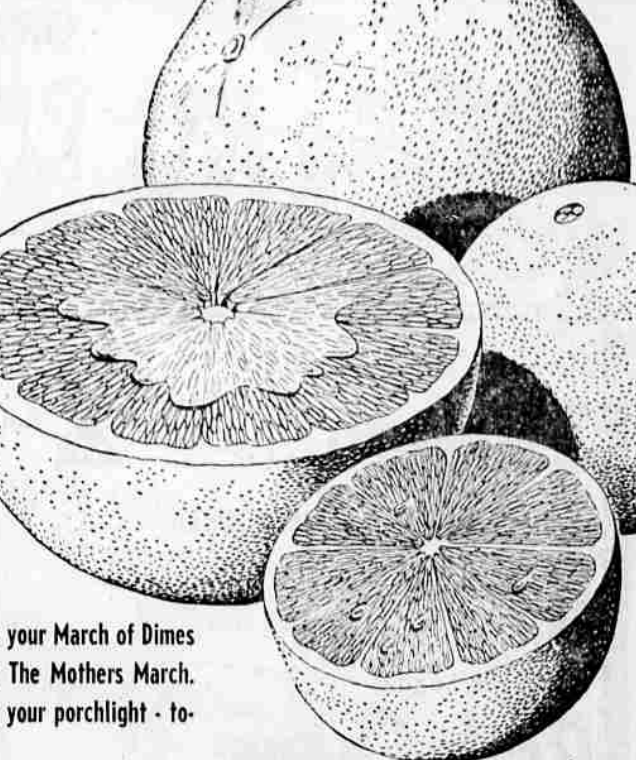
