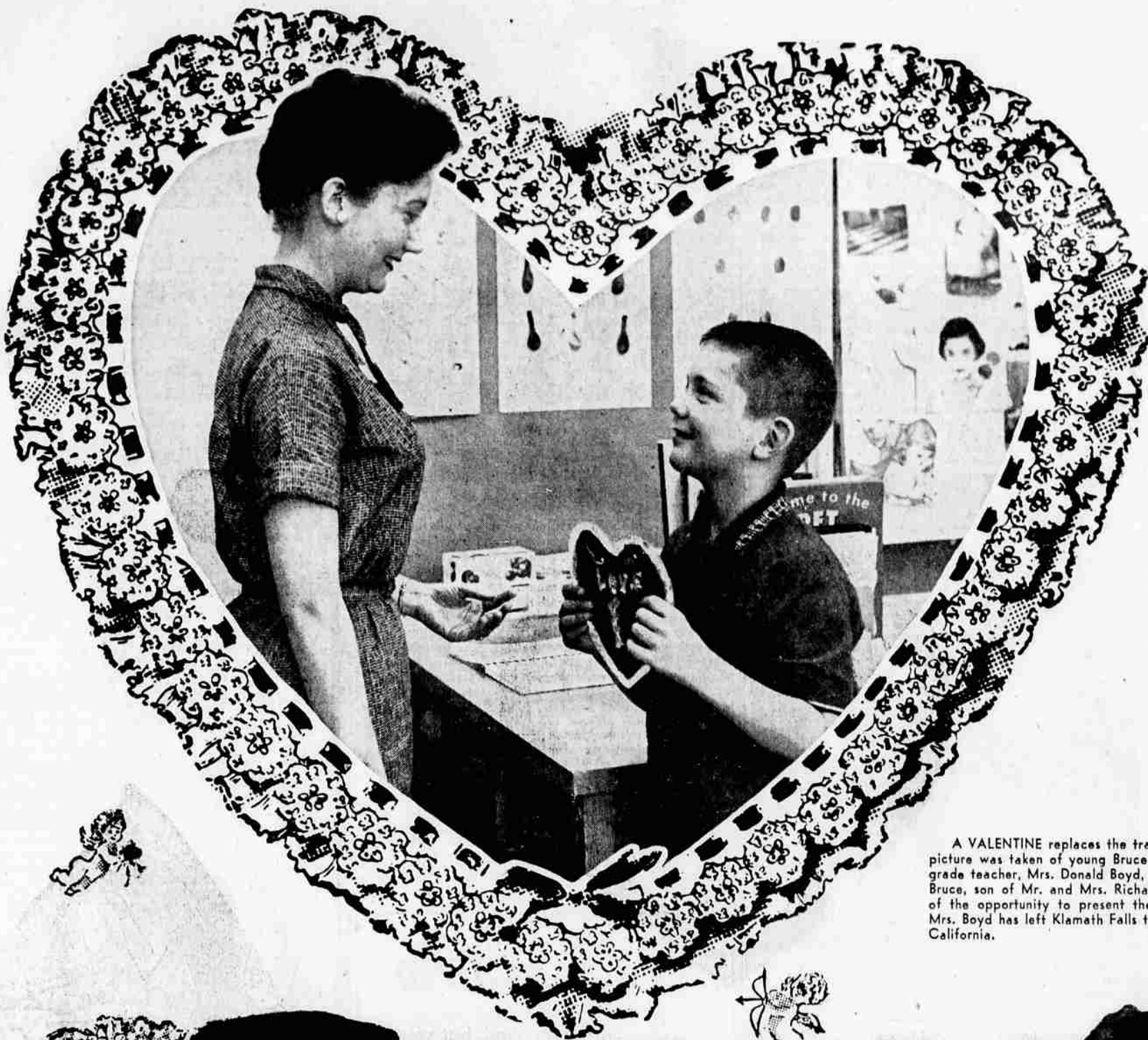


Just For Valentine's Day

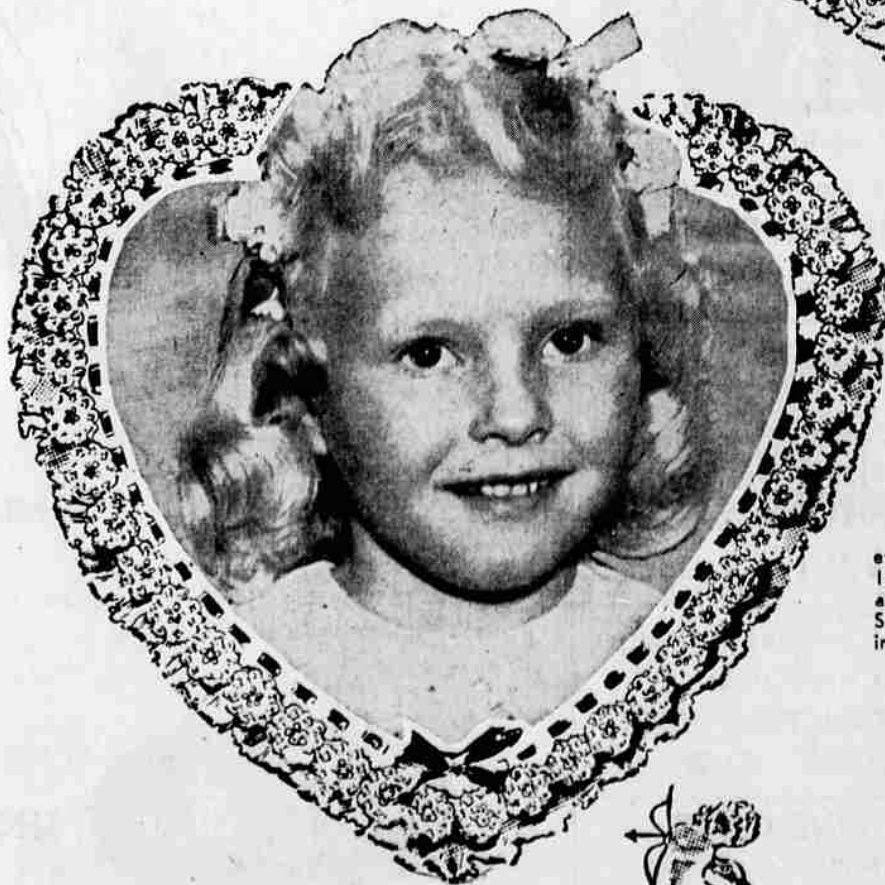
