For 8 servings, combine 3 cups mashed sweet potatoes with 3 tablespoons butter or margarine, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper, and 2 tablespoons sugar. Shape into 8 patties, roll in crushed cornflakes and bake on buttered baking sheet in pre-heated 350 degree oven 15 minutes, or until browned.

Lore Of The Vaquero Is Story Of Golden Age In California Beef History

Anyone who likes good stories of the early days in California will get a kick out of reading Rojas' book on the lore of the vaquero.

A vaquero himself, his family moving to California from Sonora, Mexico, in the 1820's, Rojas, who was born in California, has been around the ranches since he was 9 years old.

He learned the lore at this tender age and has spent the last 46 years of his life on ranches in and around the Kern County area.

The reader will find the book refreshingly different in that it has no message, does not purport to be great literature and has as its sole theme the retelling of the stories, legends and personalities of the early day—and now gone—vaqueros of the golden age in California.

Humor is deeply interwoven in the stories, the laughing way of life and the happy acceptance of events with which these people lived their lives being passed on to the reader in the natural story telling style of Rojas.

There are also stories of mishap and hardship, of hard times and good times.

No-Smoke Method Used

NEW YORK (UPI)—Two large incinerators that between them can burn 320 scrapped automobile bodies a day without giving off black smoke of noxious gases have gone to work in New York City.

The incinerators, large enough to serve all the scrapped-car dealers in New York, were made necessary by a new city air pollution law prohibiting the open burning of auto bodies. Officials said Atlanta is the only other city in the country with comparable facilities.

One of New York's new installations is known as Pyrocleaner-200. In this plant, smoke passes through furnaces where fuel-oil flames raise the temperature to 1,500 degrees. The smoke and flames are then passed through red-hot firebrick chambers where the smoke is consumed by combustion.

In the second incinerator, known as Smokatron, the smoke passes through an intense electrical field where the millions of tiny carbon particles are charged and collected on the pipe walls. Water sprays wash them away later.

VETERAN INMATE

ST. CATHERINES, Ont. (UPI)—William Mallette thinks there's no place like jail. The 26-year-old Canadian has spent all but about one year since 1948 behind prison walls, according to Crown attorney Lloyd Goodwin. He was assured another five years confinement recently when he was convicted of breaking and entering three businesses in the St. Catherines area.

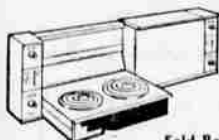

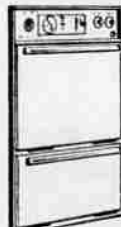

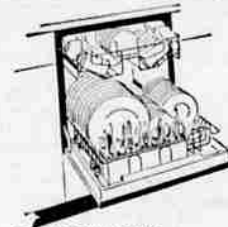
