### Settlement Given Widow

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Tyrone Power's widow and his three children will get \$2,500 a month living expenses from the actor's estate.

Superior Judge Burdette J. Daniels, setting the allowance Monday, advised survivors to tighten their belts "until we find the condition of this estate."

He ordered \$1,500 a month for Power's widow and third wife Deborah, 27, and their newborn son. The actor's second wife, Linda Christian, 31, will get \$1,000 a month for their daughters Romina, 7, and Taryn, 5.

Power's estate is estimated at about \$300,000. He also left \$370,000 in life insurance.

### Moscow Radio Makes Claim Recording Was Falsified

LONDON (UPI)—Moscow Radio quoted American newspaper editorials today in an attempt to back charges that the U.S. State Department accused Soviet airmen of shooting down an unarmed American plane to keep the cold war from thawing.

An English-language broadcast repeated earlier Soviet claims that the State Department's recording of Soviet pilots' conversations during the attack was a fake. It criticized the department for failing to make the recording public.

Soviet ambassador in Washington Mikhail Menshikov was invited by the State Department to hear the recording, but refused.

The broadcast quoted the Washington Post and Times Herald as saying the State Department and congressional indignation with its revelation. It said the New York Times thought the move was intended to aggravate Western-Soviet relations.

The New York Post was quoted as saying the U.S. government apparently took its action to drown out what Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev and Deputy Premier Anastas Mikoyan were saying about ending the cold war.

"What has been cited is enough to show that the State Department's maneuver was taken with malice aforethought," Moscow Radio added.

The broadcast also disputed State Department claims that it had the recording a long time before it was released. It quoted a United Press International interview with Rep. Wayne Hays (D-Ohio), a member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, in which Hays said committee members did not know of the recording.

"There is nothing at all surprising in this," it added. "The fabrication was concocted only recently. The State Department neither the House nor the Senate never had such a recording and Foreign Affairs Committee was does not have one. That is why informed."
