Two Workmen Escape Death

CHILOQUIN — Two men narrowly escaped death when a large section of a brick wall collapsed and partially buried them late Monday afternoon. James Chipman and Gordon David were working on the Glinger Building, helping to tear down the second story section of the four outside walls of the building which was gutted on Thanksgiving Day. Glinger had been with the men but was away temporarily. Mrs. George Lippincott was an eye witness and called out when the wall gave way.

Mrs. J. B. Rice, barber across the street, ran to call Roy Glinger and Mrs. Pearl Nygren, operator of the Indian Art and Gift Shop, ran across to pull bricks from the men. The ambulance was brought and the men were helped down the street to the doctor's office. David was released after treatment, but Chipman was found to have fractured ribs and was moved to Klamath Falls the following day by ambulance.

Glinger and his son, Leroy Glinger, Sprague River, have been using a tractor and scoop and a dump truck to haul away the many hundreds of bricks which had been torn down and those which fell accidentally. Later in the spring a two business establishment will be constructed within the now one-story high walls. Kirchers Hardware will occupy one of the locations. No announcement has been made as to the occupancy of the other.

Autoist Begins Jail Sentence

A Klamath Falls motorist began a five-months' jail term Wednesday after his third conviction for driving while his license was suspended.

Vern Ericks, 29, 1912 Last Street, also was fined \$400 after pleading guilty to the charge before District Judge D. E. Van Vactor.

Ericks was arrested by state police February 1 near the Lakeview Y. Questioning by Judge Van Vactor revealed that Ericks' license was suspended in May 1957 following an uninsured accident. He subsequently was arrested in June 1957 and June 1958 for driving while his license was suspended. On both those occasions an additional year was added to his suspension.

Ericks also was fined \$10 Wednesday for violation of basic rule.

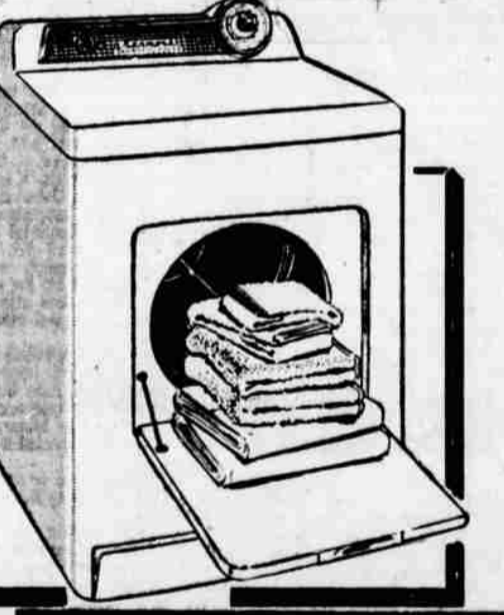
