Queen's Kin Dead At 40

LONDON (AP)—Lady Nancy Bowes-Lyon, a niece of Queen Mother Elizabeth, died Wednesday after a life beset by tragedy. She was 40 and had been in poor health for several years.

A hospital spokesman said she came to the emergency department feeling unwell and died shortly after. The cause of death was not announced.

Lady Nancy was the daughter of one of the queen mother's brothers, the late 13th Earl of Strathmore, and was the sister of the present earl.

Her first marriage, to automobile executive Lance Robinson,

ended in divorce in 1934. Her second husband, John Blair, shot himself in a friend's house in Ireland in 1935.

Lady Nancy had been hospitalized twice in previous years after overdoses of sleeping pills. News of the death was cabled long.

Taxpert Says Check Facts

Although the percentage of errors detected each year in federal income tax returns continues to decline, there are still enough to warrant the request from District Director Ralph C. Granquist of the Internal Revenue Service for Oregon, that all taxpayers check and recheck both facts and figures after completing their 1958 returns.

"While we appreciate every effort which tends to get returns to us early in the filing season, we still want taxpayers to very carefully go over their mathematics, to make sure that they have put down all the names of authorized dependents, and that they

have completed all of the other phases — supported by documents if need be — that the form and instruction booklet call for," Granquist stated.

"Along with these basic essentials, taxpayers should be careful to check over their return before filing to make sure that all required W-2's are attached, that names and addresses have been legibly entered, that signatures (both husband and wife if a joint return) have been affixed, that any check attached for taxes still owed is made out properly to the Internal Revenue Service, and that all papers comprising the complete return are placed in an envelope addressed to the District Director of the Internal Revenue Service, Portland, Oregon.

"One of the reasons we stress the need for a thorough check by the taxpayer is that the number of errors we detect calls for additional payments, with interest, and sometimes with penalties. Of course, if returns have mistakes in our favor, the taxpayer will receive the excess in a government check when the mistake is discovered.

"But, either way, we can operate more efficiently and effectively when errors are held to a minimum," Granquist stated.

Quarter Buys Life Story

SEATTLE (AP)—For a single quarter, a bidder at the King County coroner's auction Wednesday bought the poignant life story of Joseph Herman, naturalized American.

It came in a plain manila envelope containing the scraps and leavings of a lifetime board of personal documents.

Item—on Sept. 2, 1909, Stanislaus Herman, New York City, paid to Hamburg-American Lines \$116.18 for the rail and steamer passage of Joseph Herman, 11, from Tiltsil, East Prussia, to Des Moines, Ia.

Item—in October 1918, Pvt. Joseph Herman, 20, at discharged honorably from the Army of the United States and notified he had a claim against the government for injuries suffered in line of duty.

Item—in April 1933, a scrap of a letter over the illegible name of a woman tells Joseph Herman, 35, she is sorry he is out of work and that his back still hurts.

Item—on June 7, 1943, Pvt. Joseph Herman, 45, was discharged honorably from the Army of the United States. Record: military offenses, none; military skills, none.

Item—in July 1953, Joseph Herman, 55, laborer, was discharged from Firlands Sanatorium, Seattle, with arrested case of tuberculosis and told he couldn't work hard anymore.

There is one final official document—on June 7, 1954, deputy coroners were called to a downtown Seattle hotel to pick up the body of Joseph Herman, 56, suicide.

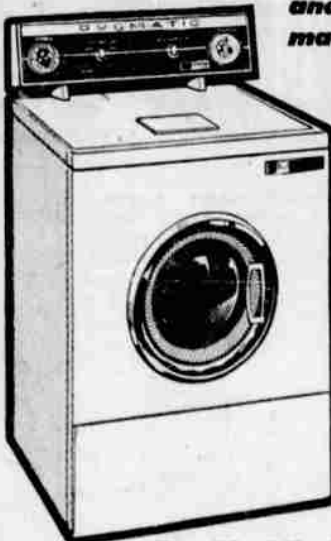
Their 3-year-old daughter Irene was found alive in woods near the Lincoln's home Wednesday night, after being missing for seven hours.

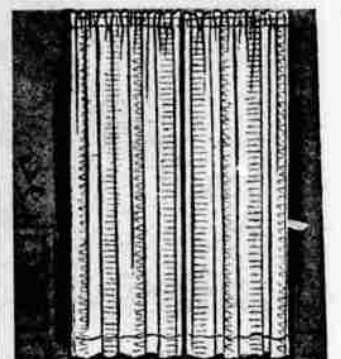
