UC Duck-Cal Bear Tussle Could Become A Squeaker

Don't be surprised if Friday night's Oregon-California Pacific Conference basketball game is a squeaker. One and two point-ers are run of the mill between those two clubs.
Scores of their past three games:
Oregon won 59-37, California by 61-60 and Oregon by 64-62.
But Cal Coach Pete Newell is forgetting history. He has a one-half game lead over Washington in his bid for a third straight PCC title and he says out in front is just where he wants to be.
The Bears are 6-2 in the standings, to Washington's 6-3 and Oregon State's 6-4. UCLA and Stanford are 5-4, Southern Cal 4-4, Idaho 4-5, Oregon 2-5 and Washington State 1-8.
The balance of the weekend schedule puts UCLA at Stanford Friday night and at California Saturday; Southern California at Idaho and then at Washington State; Oregon State at Washington State Friday night, and Oregon at Stanford Saturday night.
UCLA, always a threat with top PCC scorer Walt Torrence, is down to its third string center, Warnell Jones, a 6-foot-9 sophomore. Kent Miller, the starter, hurt an ankle. Ron Wallace, the No. 3 man, became ineligible because of low grades.
Torrence is averaging 20.5 points a game, followed by Washington's Doug Smart with 19.1.
California, leading the league and the nation in defense, has the best of the remaining schedule. After this weekend, the Bears hit the road for a trio against Washington State, Idaho and Oregon State, then come home and finish against USC, Washington State and Oregon State.
The Bears got Washington out of the way early with two victories. Since then, Darrall Imhoff, 6-10 junior, has been coming into his own as an offensive threat as well as proving himself a top defensive man. Denny Fitzpatrick leads the Cal scorers with a 12.6 average, followed by Al Buch, 11.2 and Imhoff, 10.8.

Weed, Yreka Highlight NC Hoop Action

The Northern California A League championship will be decided Friday night when Coach Al Simpson and his Weed Cougars travel to Yreka for a conference encounter with the Miners. The game will highlight a full slate of Nor-Cal action.
In other games the Mount Shasta Bears and the McCloud Loggers battle at Mt. Shasta; the Dunsmuir Tigers travel to Central Valley for a non-league match; the Clatskanie Honkers invade Dorris for a league tussle with the Butte Valley Bulldogs and the Alturas Moose Braves journey to Fall River.
High-scoring Doug Blankenship faces the Cougars against Dick Edwards' Miners and big 6-6 Bill Wilson, 6-4 Allan Eddy and 6-1 Gary Gresham in the title-deciding contest.
At Mount Shasta, McCloud coach Bob Tomlinson will send ace Melton Bonneville, against the Bears' high scorer, Jim Scoggins.
Coach Dave Blount's Dunsmuir squad will be led by forward Noel Carter when they meet Central Valley in the non-counter. The Tigers were dumped, 77-50 by Weed in their last action.
The Tulelake-Butte Valley scrap will decide who claims second place in the Nor-Cal B League. Etna has already clinched first place. The Honkers' high scorer, Bob Osborne, will be pitted against Coach Bill Morgan's Bulldog ace, Ray Goldbar and Mike Branham.

Arch, Sugar Discuss Terms

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (UPI)—Archie Moore and Sugar Ray Robinson will fight for Moore's light heavyweight crown, probably in June, if they can come to terms on splitting the purse.
That was disclosed today by Truman Gibson, president of the dissolving International Boxing Club of New York.
Preliminary conferences were concluded here Thursday night among Gibson, middleweight champion Robinson, Jack Kearns—Moore's manager—Robinson's advisers George Gainford and Harold Johnson, and Jim Norris—former boxing czar.
Gibson explained: "Robinson said flatly he wanted to fight and that he wanted to fight Archie Moore."
"This was the first time he had made it clear on both points: That he wanted to fight and that Moore is the person rather than Carmen Basilio (ex-middleweight champion)."

Ted Williams' Pride To Decide Career

NEW YORK (UPI)—Pride is the answer today as to how much longer 40-year-old Ted Williams will play baseball.
The American League batting champion doesn't know himself how much longer he will continue to wear the flannels of the Boston Red Sox. It depends primarily on how long he continues to hit like a champion.
When he doesn't, he'll step down.
Ted's current aim is to increase his standing among the all-time home run hitters. Momentarily he is in fifth place and his aim this year is to move past fourth place Lou Gehrig and close in, and pass, if possible, third place Mel Ott.
Babe Ruth leads them all with 714 homers and this, due to almost five seasons lost because of military service in World War II and the Korean conflict, is beyond Williams' reach. But Williams, with a couple of good years, could wind up in second place.
Jimmy Foxx is the runnerup with 534, a mere 52 belts ahead of the splendid splinter. Two more seasons might do it for Williams. Ott, in third place with 511, is only 29 ahead of Ted and Williams, with 482 starting the season, seems a quick cinch to gal-
