

## Varied Activities Hold Interest Of Klamath Falls Residents



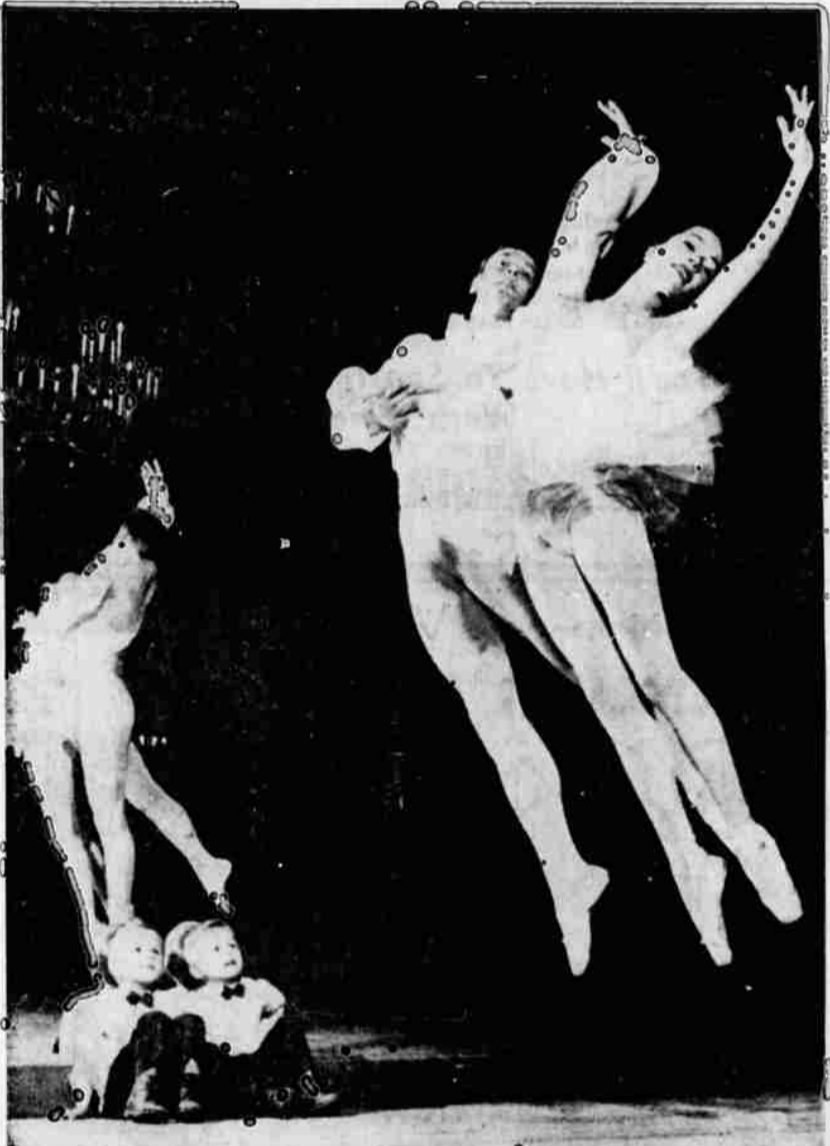

### Chicago Opera Ballet Stars Talented Dancers

The Chicago opera Ballet brings to the stage of the Pelican Theater on February 19 the dancing of internationally famous stars Marjorie Tallchief and George Skibine. "Pas de deux" means a dance duo in ballet language, but, even though he is one of the leading ballet dancers of today, George Skibine prefers the fractured French translation, "Pair of Twins." For to him and his elegant ballerina wife, Marjorie Tallchief, were born twin sons, George and Alexander, on July 3, 1952. While their parents are on tour the twins are enjoying at other little boys their age might envy, a vacation with real Indians. The boys are staying with their grandparents in Paris, France. Although born and raised in Paris, France, they are quickly adapting to the American way of life. Two brilliant young American dancers will be featured soloists of the ballet. Barbara Steele began her dancing career with Ruth Page at the Chicago Civic Opera. She was on Broadway in "Oklahoma" and had the dance lead in "Lute Song" starring Mary Martin. She also appeared with the Ballet Russe de Morge Carlo and the Ballet The George and Alexander, on July 3, 1952. Kenneth Johnson is Ruth Page's premier danseur and assistant at the Chicago Lyric Opera. The varied career of this gifted young Cleveland has won wide recognition on Broadway and on tour.
