Leaders Of Greece, Turkey Come To London For Talks

LONDON (AP)—The heads of the Greek and Turkish communities on Cyprus arrived in London Sunday for the formal talks to arrange independence for Britain's east Mediterranean colony.

House Hits Red Lawyers

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House Committee on Un-American Activities says a group of Communist lawyers rank high in a Communist fifth column active in America.

The committee made it clear it sought to focus attention upon a very small minority within the legal profession. It said the activities of the small minority should not be permitted to cast discredit on the overwhelming majority of patriotic attorneys. The House group issued a report Sunday entitled "Communist Legal Subversion." The report contained information which the committee said had been obtained in the course of investigations into broader aspects of communism.

Makarios was exiled by the British from Cyprus in 1956 because he refused to disavow the terror campaign of the EOKA underground. If agreement on the island's future is reached at the conference, he presumably will be allowed to return to his homeland at once so he can sell the agreement to the Greek Cypriots. The island's Greek majority is expected to choose him as the first president of Cyprus.

Asked if the Turkish Cypriot minority would accept Makarios as president, Kutuchuk said: "I don't think it is our place to object."

Makarios and Kutuchuk will sit down Tuesday with the foreign ministers of Britain, Greece and Turkey in a parley to draw the final terms for the conversion of Cyprus into a republic. "I go to the conference with an open mind," Makarios said in a statement at the airport. "I hope a solution is on the way to being achieved." Makarios told reporters. "The good will and understanding between Greece and Turkey has been a great step forward." The Foreign Office sent a junior official of the protocol department to meet the archbishop at the airport.
