He will speak before the Klamath Falls congregation, located at Ninth and Plum streets at 7:45 p.m. The local pastor is Elder Waldo D. Lasley.

The council agreed to review the garbage disposal agreement with George Pappas for 1959. Plans were made to have another student city council day when high school students will take over the city government. The meeting was adjourned and will reconvene on February 17.
