**Wool Mart Year To End March 31**

Chairman Earl Wilson of the Klamath County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee today reminded farmers that the marketing year under the 1958 wool program will end March 31.

The wool program is conducted under the National Wool Act of 1954. Payments under the 1958 program will be made this summer when the payment rates are determined on the basis of national average prices received by producers for shorn wool during the 1958 marketing year. Any marketings after March 31 will be eligible under the 1959 program.  
If any condition concerning the sale is not settled by March 31, the sale will not be considered as completed. Title must have passed to the buyer, the wool must have been delivered to the buyer (either physically or through documents), and the last of the factors (price per pound, weight, yield, etc.) needed to determine the total purchase price must be available.  
Applications for payment under the 1958 program must be filed with the county ASC office not later than April 30, 1959.

**No Fines Due; Return Books**

This is the week to return books to the city and county libraries. All this week, through Saturday, no fines are being collected, in the hope that persons who have been holding onto books belonging to the two libraries will take advantage of the opportunity to return them.

In order to make the returning procedure as free as possible from embarrassment, receptacles are being provided in front of both libraries for the return of books. A further inducement to return books is a week-long policy whereby each library will gladly accept the return of books belonging to the other. Thus, books may be returned to both libraries by simply visiting one.
