The March meeting will treat "New Trends in Teacher Education" with Mabel Winston, dean of women at Southern Oregon College, as the guest speaker.

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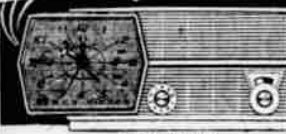
