

Heating-Cooling Combination Unit Most Practical Fix-Up Installation

"Comfort Conditioning" is an important phase of modernization that is often overlooked by homeowners. The logical time to bring a home's heating system up-to-date is during a remodeling program of any sort.

In popular usage, the term "air conditioning" has come to apply only to cooled air. Yet, for maximum healthfulness, heated air in the home requires "conditioning" even more than cooled. Thus the term "comfort conditioning" has come into being.

The importance of comfort conditioning is that it controls, not only the warmth of temperature throughout the house.

Humidifiers built into these systems automatically provide the proper amount of humidity necessary to eliminate the discomfort of desert dryness that so frequently accompanies winter heating. A blower, built into the heating unit, circulates air gently throughout the home, assuring constantly fresh indoor air, free of stales and odors. Filters, placed strategically, remove 85 percent of dust particles.

The duct work installed for warm air conditioning is readily adaptable for the addition of a summer cooling unit when the home owner's budget permits.

Plant Trees

If any house, new or old, is without trees, it will pay to invest in one or two, no matter how small.

Trees add so much in beauty to a home. They supply shade in the summer and break the force of the prevailing winds in the winter. They conserve moisture in the soil and their leaves supply organic matter for the growing of other kinds of plants.

Not to be overlooked is the likelihood of their being a nesting place for many insect-eating birds.

The purpose for which trees are chosen differ, but, regardless of the motive, some trees are much more suitable than others for planting close to the house.

On a small suburban property, there may be no room for trees that are tall and broad at maturity, no matter how slowly they grow.

Elms, maples, oaks and locust are best suited to more spacious areas.

Yellowwood, which reaches only fifty feet, magnolia, hawthorn, dogwood, redbud and cherries are in better scale for small areas. They are just as beautiful in their own way as the bigger shade trees.

Horse chestnut and catalpa are a poor choice along streets, for their blossoms and fruit will litter the sidewalk. Silver maple, poplar and willow are fast growing, but their wood is soft and short-lived. They are hardly worth the time and effort to plant them.

You may be able to afford just one tree now, so let your nurseryman help you work out a plan for present and future planting.

And, each year, one or two more trees can be added until the original plan is fulfilled.

Ceramic Tiles Add Real Beauty

In many old-world cities, tile installations over 2,000 years old are still in excellent condition. Today, the beautiful permanence and relative low cost of this ancient construction material is being rediscovered.

Most commonly used in bathrooms and kitchens, ceramic tile now is more and more used to surface entire walls and floors. Glowing and colorful, it blends magnificently with stone construction, fabric textures and furniture woods in all living areas.

In general, ceramic tile falls into three basic categories — glazed wall tile, mosaics and "quarry" tile.

A wipe with a damp cloth cleans glazed wall tile. It comes in dozens of decorative colors and a versatile variety of sizes.

Unlike glazed wall tiles, color goes all the way through unglazed ceramic mosaics. Mosaics are usually inlaid on sheets. Put together, the sheets make up in a variety of patterns in compatible colors, sizes and designs and are equally at home on floor, walls or counter-tops.

Stripes and distinctive shapes — diamonds, triangles, squares — are all possible with ceramic mosaics. "Quarry" tile is the most economical form of ceramic tile. It's rugged and ideal for porches, patios, walks and interior floors.

Dress-Up Home Entrance With Colorful Plantings

Beautiful walks are just as applicable to the very small property as to the large estate. On the smaller properties they are even more necessary because of the less space available to beautify.

A flower-bordered approach to a door always seems to provide a gay, almost eloquent "welcome."

Everyone can have a lovely walk to front or side door, or both, using favorite flowering and evergreen plants that brighten "homecoming" every day in the year.

In planting and beautifying walks, there are a few rules to observe in order to get the most out of the planting, according to the American Association of Nurserymen.

1. Usually at the beginning of a walk on the street side two shrubs, one on each corner of the walk should be somewhat higher than the planting bordering the walk. They may be small trees if they are planted farther back so they do not cover the walk as they grow.

2. A ground cover should be planted along a narrow strip on each side of the walk, so that the bare earth will not show.

Electricity Can Be A Killer In The Home

Make Garage More Orderly, More Useable

Garages are notorious for being catch-alls for everything from kids' tricycles to a conglomeration of garden equipment.

A good home improvement starter project, which will dress up the garage's interior and reduce the fire hazard, is a functional liner.

Garages, unsightly to begin with, in most cases, because they usually show unfinished wall studs, can be given interior walls that have a dual purpose — organized storage to end garage chaos, and a thousand percent improvement in appearance.

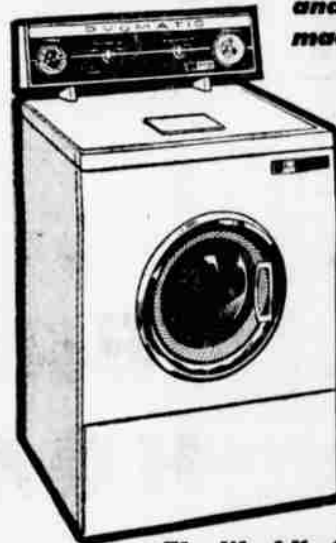
Strong metal fixtures that fit interchangeably in any of the hundreds of Peg-Board holes support storage items out of the way, yet are within easy reach.

Installing the floor-to-ceiling panels in a garage that has wall studs is easy. They are nailed or screwed to the properly-spaced vertical lumber. Leave a space the thickness of a nickel between panels to allow for expansion. Using factory-primed boards will simplify the finishing process. Both panels and matching fixtures may be obtained at lumber yards.

First step, after ordering the lining material and Masonite 4-inch Peg-Board panels — is to clean out unwanted items. The rest can be hung neatly on the new wall liner, whose perforations will hold heavy or light objects.
