ST. LOUIS (AP) — After Ed Lubanski's performance in the American Bowling Congress Tournament Wednesday and Thursday, he seems destined to win the coveted "bowler of the year" award of the Bowling Writers Assn.

Ed, of Detroit, and his Pfeiffer Reer team broke two ABC records. Lubanski's 2116 all-events total wiped out the 2088 record set two years ago by Jim Spalding of Louisville, Ky. His 784 in the singles was the third highest set in that category. He leads both divisions.

The Pfeiffer's 3243 series in the open team division, including Ed's 700 contribution, is a record and the team's 1176 finale was the third highest single game in the team division.

And the Pfeiffer's 9361 team all-events total is the second highest in the 56-year history of the tournament.

The Pfeiffer barrage was more than enough to stop the St. Louis Fallstalls, defending ABC team champions. The team shot a 3010 series to move into fourth place.

The Southern Oregon Conference leading Klamath Union Pelicans left this noon for the trip across the Greensprings and their final meeting with the Cavemen in the first of a series of games to which is probably attached more importance than any other single session of the past season. Saturday the Pelicans return home to play host to the Medford Black Tornado in the last appearance of the year on Pelican Court.

A pair of victories over the weekend not only guarantees the KU quiet another league championship but also clinches their right as the number one entrant from Southern Oregon in the coming State A-1 tournament which begins March 17 on McArthur court in Eugene.

Portland Selected By NCAA

NEW YORK (AP) — DePaul of Chicago, Idaho State and Portland (Ore.) today were named at-large entries in the NCAA Basketball Tournament, bringing to 10 the number of teams in the field for the collegiate championships.

The selections, made by R. S. "Spec" Kene of Oregon State — the chairman of the NCAA's Western Selection Committee, were announced by the NCAA Service Bureau here.

Idaho State, the leader in the Rocky Mountain Conference, will be making a record seventh successive appearance in the tournament. Only four-time champion Kentucky has made more overall appearances, 10.

It's the fourth time in the NCAA for DePaul and the first for Portland.

DePaul and Portland will meet in a first round game at Portland, Ore., at a date to be chosen, probably March 9, 10 or 11. The winner will advance to the Midwest regional at Lawrence, Kan., to play Kansas State of the Big Eight Conference as part of a double-header March 13. The double-header also matches Southwest Conference champion Texas Christian with the Missouri Valley Conference champion, probably Cincinnati.

Idaho State will play the Border Conference champion, Texas Western, New Mexico State and Arizona State U. are in the running at a site and date to be announced. The winner will advance to the Far West regional at San Francisco against St. Mary's (Calif.), the West Coast Athletic Conference champ, on March 13. The Pacific Coast Conference champion (California leads) and the Skyline winner (Utah holds first place) meet in the other game of the San Francisco double-header.

Eastern Kentucky, the Ohio Valley Conference champion and warming up for play in the NCAA, had a letdown — losing to East Tennessee, 93-80.

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The Pelicans terminated the Putnam, '58 all-conference, who took his practices Wednesday afternoon with speedy drills and an emphasis on defense and foul shooting. Thursday the varsity players met with coach Dean White for a little chat that underlined the importance of their assignment.

"One at a time, one at a time" as been the motto around the court and conference room since the current season began. The Pelicans seem determined to continue the same thought as they head for Grants Pass. The Cavemen topped the Pelicans 82-51 in the first game match of the season but since then the Pelicans have picked up two wins over the squad of coach Gordon Prehm.

D'Olivo Ranked Twelfth

The heir apparent to Elgin Baylor as Pacific Northwest collegiate basketball scoring king is D'Olivo Anderson of Seattle Pacific — as of this moment. The crown is not yet his.

Gonzaga's Frank Burgess has the best chance to overhaul the lean sharpshooter of the Seattle Pacific Falcons. Ray Washburn of Whitworth still is in the running.

None of the three, however, will approach Baylor's 1958 performance in his final season at Seattle University. He stacked up 975 points for an average of 31.7. Anderson has 546 points and a 22.75 average. Burgess 482 of 21.9. Washburn 514 of 21.4.

Running out of opportunity, Anderson has only one game to play. Washburn has at least two and Burgess at least four — plus the possibility of post-season tournament action.
