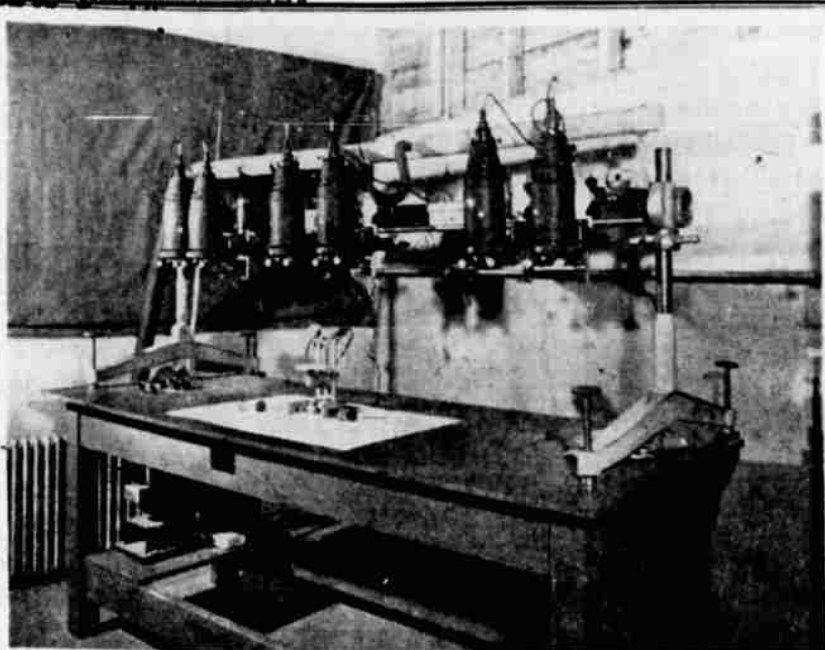

NEW instructional equipment for use of students in photogrammetry classes at Oregon Tech is shown. The Bausch & Lomb Multiplex mapping machine will be used by students in highway technology and surveying technology to practice cartography and put into use their classroom theory. Machine operates on the same stereoscopic principle as 3-D movies. Each pair of projectors has red and green filters and the operator wears spectacles with red and green color for each eye. By manipulating a floating dot of light on the tracing table, accurate vertical and horizontal distances can be traced on a map manuscript. This method, with some variation also lends itself to reconnaissance and planning of highways and hydroelectric systems.
