FRUIT SALAD

Remember Grandma's old-fashioned fruit salad? Here's an easy version with no fruits to chop. "24-Hour Fruit Salad" is made with handy canned fruit cocktail—a colorful mixture of green seedless grapes, cling peaches, pears, pineapple and maraschino cherries. This is a sweet salad—one sure to be popular with children and nostalgic adults. It's very good indeed with fried chicken.

24-HOUR FRUIT SALAD

1 (No. 2½) can fruit cocktail
2 cups miniature marshmallows (or 16 large marshmallows, quartered)
1 cup commercial sour cream
¼ teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
Butter lettuce
¼ cup roasted blanched sliced almonds
Drain fruit cocktail. Combine with remaining ingredients, except lettuce and almonds, and mix lightly. Chill 24 hours. Spoon into lettuce cups on salad plates. Sprinkle almonds over top. Makes 6 servings.

FRUIT DRESSING

For avocado and grapefruit salad or other fruit combinations, combine ¼ cup pineapple juice, ¼ cup orange juice, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, ¼ cup salad oil, 1 teaspoon sugar and ¼ teaspoon salt. Beat or shake until well blended. Makes ¼ cup dressing.

EGG SAUCE

Melt 2 tablespoons butter, stir in 2 tablespoons flour. Add 1 cup of milk gradually, stirring constantly. Cook until thickened, stirring occasionally. Just before serving, fold in 2 tablespoons lemon juice and 1 chopped hard-cooked egg. Garnish with two tablespoons chopped parsley. If using as a sauce for salmon loaf, use ¼ cup milk and ¼ cup juice from the salmon.

PEACHES

Canned cling peaches, brushed with maple syrup and then broiled, make a pleasant change for breakfast fruit, particularly when served with breakfast sausage, ham or bacon.

HAM

Baked ham takes kindly to a simply basting with California Port. A little sherry stirred into creamed crab or other fish mixtures does wonders for the flavor.

SOUP

The per capita consumption of canned soup has more than doubled in the United States since 1937, according to the Campbell Soup Company. The New York State Cooperative Extension Service reports each of us ate 5.1 pounds of soup in 1937, 8.8 pounds each in 1947 and 13½ pounds each in 1957. Tomato is the most popular canned soup with chicken noodle coming in second and vegetable third.

Broccoli should be cooked until barely tender, still a little crisp. Serve topped with sieved egg yolk, crumbled crisp bacon or strips of pimiento.

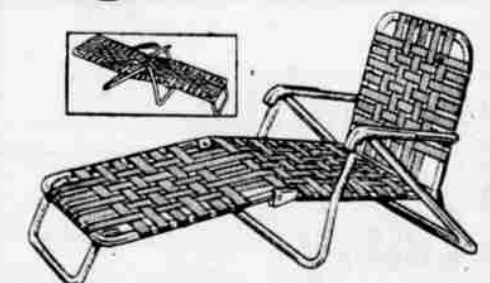
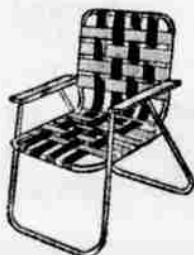
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
