Police Seek RR Engineer

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Police hunted today for the engineer of a speeding freight which slammed into a passenger train, killing 11 persons and injuring more than 70.

The collision occurred Thursday near Xometla, about 27 miles south of Mexico City.

Javier Garcia Travesi, an investigator for the federal district attorney, said both engineers may have been at fault. Preliminary investigation indicated the engineer of the passenger train halted to repair a bearing without putting out warning flags. Garcia said the freight engineer appar-

ently failed to give the passenger train a required 10-minute head start and was traveling at high speed.

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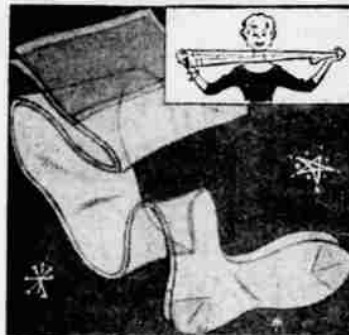
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
