Local Priest New Mexico Disc Jockey

SANTA FE, N.M. (UPI)—The graying 48-year-old priest flips on the record, then tells his radio listeners in colloquial Spanish something that might be translated as: "Now dig this latest number from Mexico City."

Msgr. Glynn Patrick Smith is a disk jockey. He conducts his show, "Monsignor Pat's Music," three times weekly over a local radio station (KTRC) and has a lot of fun doing it. He ad-libs a bit about his parish in Santa Fe and the \$250,000 debt that hangs over its new elementary school.

But the Roman Catholic clergyman cuts the talk short and the records spinning from his private library of Mexican and Spanish music. He has 6,000 to 8,000 recordings, and believes it is the largest collection of its kind in the American Southwest.

The most popular songs with his listeners are ranchera's, Mexico's version of western music. "They've always got a story to tell, which is not always true of our westerns," the cleric explained.

Next in order of popularity come boleros and huapangos pronounced "wha-pang-goes" and called "yellers" in the trade. Waltzes, hymns and popular United States music, their lyrics translated into Spanish, are the least popular.

"I can't get enough of it," he said, relaxing in a plaid shirt at his broadcasting booth in a corner of the church rectory.

He is also a "ham" radio operator and has perfected an echo sound device to make bad singers "sound like a million dollars." He said this has baffled radio engineers.

Msgr. Smith was born in Chicago and educated for the priesthood there.

Twenty years ago he became parish priest in the little village of Questa in northern New Mexico.

He prides himself on his command of Spanish slang, and his English vocabulary is spiced disk jockey lingo.

But from the pulpit of Cristo Rey Church in Santa Fe he is careful to speak grammatically in either language — mostly Spanish since he figures that is what 92 per cent of his parishioners also speak.

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
