Navy Seeking Air Cadets

The Navy wants young men to fill out its air arm.

Potential fliers can enroll in two flight training programs. They are the Naval Aviation Cadet and the Aviation Officer Candidate programs.

To get into the NAVCAD program, a male US citizen must be a college student between 18 and 25 years of age. He must be in good health, unmarried and he must agree not to marry until commissioned.

He must have finished his second year at an accredited college or university with at least 90 quarter hours' or 60 semester hours' credit. Application may be made three months before a student is scholastically eligible.

Finally, he must pass a written test. He will take pre-flight training at Pensacola, Florida, for 18 weeks followed by 14 months of flight training before his commission as an ensign in the Navy reserve. An active duty term of three and one-half years is added during which time he may apply for transfer to the regular Navy as a career officer.

Applicants for the AOC program, aside from having to prove citizenship, must possess baccalaureate degrees from accredited colleges or universities. They must be between 19 and 26 years of age. Married men are acceptable.

Candidates may apply for the program anytime during the senior college year. They get 16 weeks' officers' training, and if they make the grade, will breeze through flight training while commissioned and drawing full officers' pay. Their enlistment terms are identical to those of NAVCADs.
