The new approach, ordered by Postmaster General Ernest Marples to make the service more helpful, was only a couple of

"Fleet Street operator, can I help you?"

We said we could understand that, since the operators during the night are all men and the operators during the day are girls.

"Will the girls be able to give their names under this new friendly telephone service?" we asked.

"Are you kidding? The telephone service isn't that friendly."

We excused ourselves.

"That's all right," said the operator. "Hope you've learned something about the new service."

We assured him we had learned one thing.

Puerto Rican Governor Views Caribbean Woes

SAN JUAN, P.R. (UPI) — The non-intervention policy of the Organization of American States (OAS) should be modified to permit action in nations having dictatorships, Gov. Luis Munoz Marín of Puerto Rico said in an exclusive interview today.

Munoz is a staunch supporter of Cuban revolutionary leader Fidel Castro, who is committed to support revolutionary efforts in the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Nicaragua and Paraguay, on grounds the leaders in those countries are dictators.

"The non-intervention pact in the OAS has been used against the people and in support of dictatorship," Munoz said. "It should be modified to set up a tribunal to authorize action in countries where the denial of human rights exists."

"Such supranational activity would get the United States off the hook of having to deal with such situations individually," Munoz said.

Castro himself believes the four target dictatorship nations should be expelled from the OAS and has publicly considered the possibility of Cuba withdrawing from the organization otherwise.

Munoz, who has been in the lead in the defense of the Castro government, in television radio and press interviews does not appear to be in complete agreement with Castro's opinion of Nicaragua, where Munoz indicates he believes President Luis Somoza is attempting to liberalize the government.

Munoz, who as an American citizen obviously likes the role of interpreting Latin America to the United States and vice versa, voiced criticism of past United States policies.

"Fidel would have been one of the greatest assets to the United States in Latin America if the Department of State had maintained the proper attitude of leniency and stayed at arm's length in dealing with the Batista dictatorship during the revolution," Munoz said.

He said that "President Romulo Betancourt of Venezuela is probably the United States' best friend today, but I presume the fact he belonged to the Communist Party once for two or three years will be used against him."

Munoz is a former newspaperman who turned expert international politician. He heads the popular Democratic Party, which is solidly liberal and pro-america.

The governor speaks English and Spanish without a trace of accent in either language. He is regarded here as a major counselor to Vice President Richard M. Nixon on Latin American affairs.

Munoz carries a baseball bat and gloves in his official car and often takes time out on inspection tours to play catch with cabinet officers.
