LONDON (AP)—"Oh, Edith, you really are an ass!" "Vulgar abuse," came the report. It was strictly a woman's row in the House of Commons Thursday night between two stalwarts of feminine rights.

House Chairman Charles Rogers showed gallantry—or diplomacy—with the innocent explanation "I didn't hear a word" when some male complained of the unladylike language.

The flareup came during a debate on the National Health Service.

Dr. Edith Summerskill, a diehard Socialist, protested American companies were among firms flooding the British market with high-priced drugs.

Dame Irene Ward, a diehard Tory, objected and shouted the "ass" remark at her distaff colleague.

Male members of the House, who customarily address even their bitterest political rivals as "the honorable member," were stunned.

"I am surprised," said Dr. Edith, "that Dame Irene should be so feline."

"Well, really," replied Dame Irene, "it is too ridiculous to take that line."

Dr. Edith, 58, and an outspoken critic of legalized prize fighting, and Dame Irene, who refuses to disclose her age, are personal friends outside the political arena.

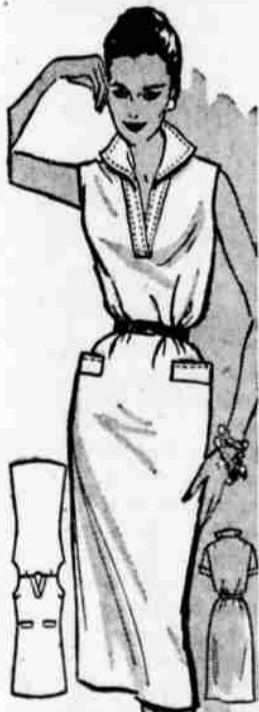

Youths Stage Mass Funeral

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP)—Arab youths chanting "There is no God but God" and "Death to Kassem" carried the body of an Iraq rebel through Damascus streets today in a mass funeral demonstration.

Thousands swarmed into the 12-century old Omayed mosque and flood in front of the courtyard listening to Moslem and Christian leaders denounce Iraqi Premier Abdel Karim Kassem. The crowds called Kassem an enemy of God.

The funeral was that of Col. Mohammed Said Shehab, Iraqi rebel wounded during fighting early this week at Mosul in northern Iraq. Shehab escaped into Syria despite his wounds. He died in Damascus Wednesday.

The funeral demonstration is expected to spark an all-out propaganda war between President Gamal Abdel Nasser of the United Arab Republic and Kassem.

Nasser showed his bitterness toward Kassem in two speeches to Damascus throngs the past two days. He accused Kassem of trying to spread a Communist reign of terror in the Arab world.
