Singer Files Second Suit

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Singer Helen O'Connell has filed a second suit for separate maintenance against her husband, Thomas Chamale, and says she fears for her life.

The former vocalist with the late Jimmy Dorsey's band said Thursday she has employed a bodyguard. She said Chamale—whom she married two years ago—threatened to kill her and her daughter by a previous marriage.

Miss O'Connell had dismissed an earlier separate maintenance suit after reconciling with Chamale. She asks \$1,699 a month temporary alimony and child support.

Yale Students Fling Ended; Snow Hits Cop

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — About 300 Yale students had a brief fling Thursday night. It lasted until one of them flung a snowball at a policeman.

The students were gathered near the campus throwing snowballs at motorists, police said. Motorists stopped, police arrived, and someone beaned a cop.

The result: eight patrol cars and paddy wagons arrived, and at least 21 students were charged with breach of peace. Police said 10 persons were slightly injured in the riot, three of them policemen.

Phones In Bly Switch Over To Elgin-3

Promptly at 11 a.m. Saturday Bly telephone subscribers will have a new chore.

They will have to dial an additional two numbers when they want to place a call.

The Bly system is graduating then from a stopgap three-number dial system to a full-grown Elgin 3 prefix followed by four numerals. The changeover is costing the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company \$97,000.

The new system will allow operators anywhere in the country to dial Bly direct. Previously they had to route their calls through Klamath Falls.

The Elgin prefix is unique in the area to Bly. It is a part of a PT&T plan to cover the nation and Canada with a direct-ampersand dialing system.

Bly residents will get information about how to use the system, in case they don't already know. And they will receive directories listing the new numbers. Copies will also be available at the company's Klamath Falls business office.

No ceremonies are contemplated for the changeover. There's not time for them. Thayne Cole, manager of the Klamath Falls and Bly exchanges, said his men are going to be working feverishly on the new system right up until deadline.

He added that later, when the smoke and clamor have cleared, the company plans an open house with guided tours.

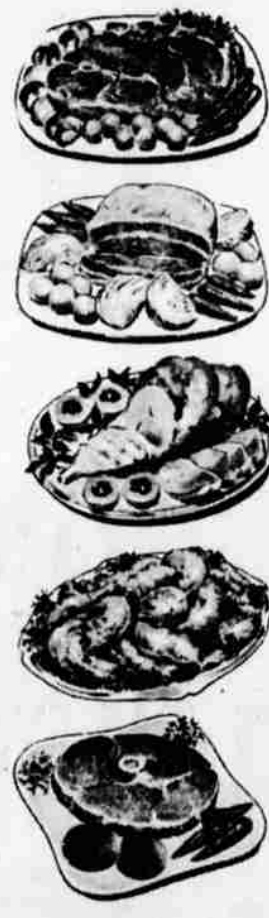

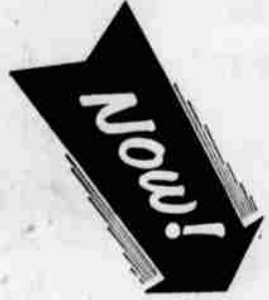
