

Davey Moore To Try For Feather Title

Davey Moore attempts Wednesday night to become the second member of the great American Olympic boxing team of 1932 to win a world professional championship.
The fast, hard-hitting Olympian from Springfield, Ohio, takes on World Featherweight Champion Hogan (Kid) Bassey of Nigeria in a 15-round title scrap at the Los Angeles Olympic Auditorium. The bout, starting at 10 p.m. EST, will be telecast coast to coast (ABC).
Floyd Patterson won the Olympic 165-pound crown in Finland in 1952 and went on to capture the pro heavyweight title. Four other U.S. fighters earned gold medals at Helsinki. Moore wasn't one of the champs. He reached the quarter-finals.
Bassey, winner of his last 11 fights, is a 4-5 choice over the No. 1 contender, who has swept his last 13 scraps. The muscular Nigerian champion has a 34-10-1 record, including 20 knockouts. Moore's record is 35-5-1, including 15 knockouts. Each stands 5-3 and, for little men, hit with authority.
Los Angeles and an area 250 miles around the city will be blacked out of the telecast. The promoters hope to draw a crowd of 10,000 and a \$90,000 gate. Bassey, 26, has been guaranteed \$45,000 against 40 per cent of the receipts. Moore will collect 20 per cent.

Tigers To Lose 3 Top Players

KANSAS CITY (AP) — Tennessee A&I loses three aces that have carried the all-Negro team to the NAIA basketball championship three years. But indications are the Tigers will be the team to beat again next year.
The hot shooting Nashville team, coached by John McLendon, won its third National Intercollegiate championship Saturday night, beating Pacific Lutheran College 97-87 in the finals.
Tennessee A&I, a big three—Dick Barnett, John Barnhill and Jim Satterwhite—have completed their NAIA eligibility after three successful trips to the tournament. Barnett made 26 points against Pacific Lutheran to run his three-tournament total to 390 points, a meet record.
McLendon said it would be two or three years before his school would get in the championship class again.
What McLendon didn't mention, however, was that his holdovers will include 6-7 Ben Warley and 6-5 Gene Werts, each a hero in this tournament, and Porter Merveth, a speedy freshman.
Southwest Texas State of San Marcos nipped Fort Hays (Kan) State 87-60 for third place in the 6-day tournament that involved 32 teams.

Paul Harney Wins \$15,000

PENSACOLA, Fla. (AP) — Slender Paul Harney, the long hitting professional from Worcester, Mass., accomplished three major objectives by winning the \$15,000 Pensacola Open Golf Tournament. His superb 19 under par 269 set a tournament record, virtually clinched an invitation to the Masters Tournament at Augusta, Ga., and assured him of a chance to play in the rich Tournament of Champions at Las Vegas.
The 29-year-old golfer, 69-63-73-70-269 was four strokes better than the tournament record of 273 set by Art Wall Jr., of Pocono Manor, Pa., in 1957. It also won him \$2,000 in prize money.
Harney has wanted to play in the Masters ever since he turned pro in 1954. He now leads the winter circuit by a comfortable margin and the two top players in the circuit are invited to the Masters.
Jay Hebert of Sanford, Fla., took second place and \$1,500 with a 68-72-65-67-272. His two final rounds included 11 birdies and an eagle. The third round was rained out Saturday and all contestants had to play 36 holes Sunday.
Tied for third place were 45-year-old Chandler Harper of Portsmouth, Va., and Bob Rosburg of Palo Alto, Calif., each with 276.

CBS Announces Teevee Schedule

NEW YORK (UPI) — The "Game of the Week" program to be televised by the Columbia Broadcasting System during the coming major league baseball season actually will be two games per week, according to plans announced today.
CBS said it will telecast a big league game every Saturday and Sunday afternoon this year, starting on April 11, with 23 Saturday games running through Sept. 20 and 24 Sunday games running through Sept. 20, between the Yankees and the Boston Red Sox will inaugurate the series.
The series will be telecast nationally except into major league cities and those minor league cities in which a game is in progress. Telecasts are "blackout" within 30 miles of cities in which the game being televised is being played.
