Alcoholism Meet Begins

SALT LAKE CITY (UPI)—The National Council on Alcoholism today opened what is described as "the largest" convocation of experts ever assembled on the problem of alcoholism.

It was the first time in 15 years the NCA's annual meeting was held west of the Rocky Mountains. Theme of the meeting was "counterattack against alcoholism."

R. Brinkley Smithers, NCA president, said the meeting will feature participants from medicine, psychiatry, psychology, the churches, education, social sciences, penology, and industry.

The three-day program will include community workshops for local NCA affiliates, institutes for casework supervisors and caseworkers, and institutes for the homeless and institutional alcoholic.

Speakers will include Robert Aikenhead, Detroit, Mayor's Rehabilitation Committee on Skid Row Problems; Alan E. Schwartz, Detroit, Michigan Committee on the Homeless and Institutional Alcoholic; Rev. Thomas J. Shipp, pastor, Lovers Lane Methodist Church, Dallas; Joan K. Jackson, research assistant professor of Sociology at University of Washington; Mrs. Marty Mann, executive NCA director; and Dr. Ruth Fox, psychiatrist and medical director of the NCA.

SEARCH QUEEN ELIZABETH — NEW YORK (UPI) — FBI agents, U. S. customs inspectors and reported Scotland Yard men swarmed aboard the liner Queen Elizabeth in quarantine Monday and searched it closely.

Officials refused to comment but it was reported they were looking for \$420,000 worth of jewels stolen from Lady Norah Docker's locked Rolls Royce last week in Southampton, England. A customs spokesman said nothing unusual was found.

GI Collects More Awards

Sgt. L. C. M. W. Buess, an Army recruiter stationed in Klamath Falls, has collected two more trophies.

He was given a handsome desk set that is his for keeps because he averaged 176 per cent of his assigned enlistee quota from July 1 to December 31.

And he was awarded a wall plaque that he will be able to keep for a month because he hit 240 per cent of quota last month. Buess was awarded the plaque twice before.

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Court Rules For Family Harassed By Gold Balls

TRENTON, N.J. (AP) — The New Jersey Supreme Court has ruled unanimously for the comfort of a family which found life next to a golf course scarcely up to par.

The court ruled 6-0 Tuesday that the drive over the pond at the third hole of the Ramsey Golf and Country Club is hazardous to the home life of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Sans and their two children.

The stroke must be eliminated, the court said, thereby coincidentally easing matters for course cutters.

The backyard of the Sans' home in Ramsey is a few feet from the pond.

What that meant for the Sans was described by Justice John J. Francis: "The constant movement of the players to and from the tee in close proximity to their rear lawn and house was accompanied by a flow of conversation which became annoying and burdensome to them."

"It awakened them and their children as early as 7 in the morning and it pervaded their home all day long until twilight."

TOKYO (AP) — Japanese Premier Nobusuke Kishi today opened Asia's first productivity conference and expressed hope the three-day meeting would help overcome poverty and contribute toward world peace.

Kishi's government called the 13-nation parley to discuss ways of improving productivity in Asia.

Attending the conference are 47 delegates and observers from Afghanistan, Burma, Cambodia, Ceylon, Nationalist China, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaya, Nepal, Pakistan, the Philippines, Thailand, South Viet Nam and Japan.
