

Child Guidance Clinic Opens Here On Friday

Stated for two addresses at the annual two-day meeting of the Klamath County Child Guidance Clinic is Dr. William F. Finzer, director of the Pittsburgh Child Guidance Center of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The annual meeting will be held Friday, March 27, in the Mills School auditorium.

Dr. Finzer will make a talk on family mental health during the Friday afternoon general session which starts at 2 p.m. He will be introduced by Dr. S. M. Kerron, Klamath County public health officer. Dr. Finzer will speak also during the Saturday morning session which will commence at 9 a.m. at the school.

In addition, he will be a panel member during Saturday afternoon's general discussion period. The two-day meeting is planned to be of interest to the laymen. "The advisory council members feel that nearly every person is interested in the psychological approach to every day problems which arise in a family," Mrs. Geary said.

Mrs. Geary emphasizes that the workshop is not intended primarily for "problem" cases. The programs are not planned for a discussion of juvenile delinquency, but are aimed at permitting discussion of ordinary phases of successful family life.

Dr. Finzer is stopping in Klamath Falls for three days on his way to attend the American Orthopsychiatric Association's 36th annual meeting in San Francisco.

He has impressive background, having received his bachelor of science degree from Ohio University at Athens and his M.D. degree from Western Reserve University in Cleveland in 1943. Following a rotating internship in Cleveland, he was trained in general psychiatry at the Menninger Clinic in Topeka, Kansas.

He received training in child psychiatry in Reading and Philadelphia. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in Psychiatry, a member of the American Medical Association, the American Orthopsychiatric Association and of the American Academy of Child Psychiatry.

In addition to being director of the Pittsburgh Child Guidance Center, he is an assistant professor, Department of Psychiatry, University of Pittsburgh Medical School.

Planting Work Is Continuing

MONTAGUE—Large scale planting operations are continuing this year on the 1955 Haystack Burn, Ranger Frank Tucker of the Yreka District, Klamath National Forest, announced Tuesday, March 17.

Three planting contractors have started work on 2,700 acres in the burn. When they finish approximately 1,782,000 more pine trees will have been planted for the future timber supply.

A forest service crew is also planting on 30 acres of cleared land in the Big Humbug drainage. Extensive preparations for this year's program were carried out last year by helicopter herbicide spraying. Eradication by this method was very effective on the heavy brush coming in after the disastrous burn.
