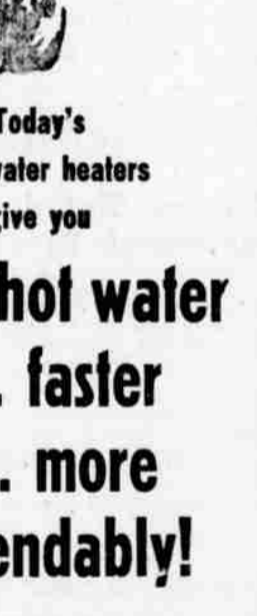

**Education Aid Hearing Set**

PORTLAND (AP)—Parents and teachers have been invited to Salem tonight to attend hearings on bills for increasing state aid to education.

The invitations were issued earlier by the Oregon Education Assn. and were repeated Sunday by several state legislators appearing on the KGW-TV program Viewpoint.

Rep. Shirley Field (R-Portland) and Sen. Monroe Sweetland (D-Milwaukie) said they expect 2,500 persons at Salem tonight for hearings on House Bill 514 and Senate Bill 94. The House bill calls for \$20,400,000 in grants of \$20 per child the next two years. The Senate bill would increase the

basic school support from \$105 to \$120. It would cost an additional 15 million dollars.

Also appearing on the program were Sen. Edwin Durno (R-Medford) and Senate President Walter J. Pearson (D-Portland). They both spoke in favor of Pearson's plan for a 3 per cent sales tax with the revenue going to education.
