NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPOUND TRESPASSING LIVESTOCK

Notice is hereby given that all livestock found trespassing upon lands owned or controlled by the United States within the Goose Lake District, Surprise Valley District, South Fork District, Big Valley District, Devils Garden District, and Doublehead District, Modoc National Forest, State of California will be impounded by the United States Forest Service on or after April 15, 1959, if the same be not previously removed permanently from the national forest.

After the impoundment, owners of trespassing livestock may regain possession thereof only by first reimbursing the United States in full for the expenses incurred in advertising, gathering, impounding, and feeding or pasturing said livestock. All impounded animals not redeemed within five days after impoundment will be offered for sale at public auction. Animals not sold at the public sale will be sold at private sale or condemned and destroyed, as required by the regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture.

Insect Dye Comeback Set

MEXICO CITY (AP) — A dye made from cactus-fed insects is making a comeback after a century and a half.

It is cochineal, a crimson or carmine dye made from the bodies of females of an insect called cochineal cactus.

Aztec Indians made it in Mexico long before the Spaniards arrived in 1519. For a long time Mexico was the world's major supplier of the dye—millions of dollars worth of it.

Then the aniline dyes knocked cochineal out of the textile industry. But lately requests have come from several countries, mainly Great Britain. It is wanted for foodstuffs as a colorant, and for a new textile which, for technical reasons, can not use aniline.

Dr. Rubin de la Borbolla, of the Museo de Artes Populares, has located Indians who inherited the technique of production. A new station has been set up in Oaxaca.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, TO CON-

LEGAL NOTICE

STRICT AND LAY A TRUNK SANITARY SEWER LINE ALONG SHASTA WAY FROM SOUTH SIXTH STREET TO WASHBURN WAY AND A SUB SEWER LINE ALONG WASHBURN WAY FROM SHASTA WAY TO PERSHING WAY AND ALONG PERSHING WAY FROM WASHBURN WAY TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 563 FEET SOUTHEASTERLY ALONG PERSHING WAY FROM THE EASTERLY LINE OF WASHBURN WAY.

APPROVING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES THEREFOR FILED BY THE CITY ENGINEER, DESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PROPERTY BENEFITED, AND DIRECTING CERTAIN STEPS TO BE TAKEN, SAID PROJECT TO BE KNOWN AS SEWER UNIT NO. 26A.

The City Engineer of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, and the specifications and estimates for the cost of constructing and laying what is known as the 26A sewer unit of the City of Klamath Falls, extending along Shasta Way from South Sixth Street to Washburn Way and along Washburn Way from Shasta Way to Pershing Way and along Pershing Way from Washburn Way to a point approximately 563 feet southeasterly along Pershing Way from the easterly line of Washburn Way, embracing in said unit all of the territory hereinafter bounded and described, and the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, Common Council having taken said plans, specifications and estimates under consideration, and having determined the boundaries of the sewer unit, now finds all thereof satisfactory.

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, DULY ASSEMBLED IN REGULAR SESSION AS FOLLOWS:

Section I.

That the plans, specifications and estimates for the construction and installation of what is known as the 26A sewer unit of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, filed with the City by the City Engineer, shall be, and the same are hereby approved and adopted.

Section II.

That the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, hereby declares its intention to construct and install the 26A Sewer Unit of said City in accordance with the said plans, specifications, and estimates; that project consist of constructing and laying a trunk sanitary sewer line along Shasta Way from South Sixth Street to Washburn Way and sub sewer line along Washburn Way from Shasta Way to Pershing Way from the easterly line of Washburn Way, to a point approximately 563 feet southeasterly along Pershing Way from the easterly line of Washburn Way; that the sewer line will be constructed of either concrete pipe, or vitrified clay pipe, or asbestos cement pipe, together with all manholes and other necessary appurtenances, all as more fully shown by the plans and specifications on file with the Recorder of said City, at a total cost as follows, to-wit:

Concrete sewer pipe with rubber ring joints, \$22,233.13.

Vitrified Clay sewer pipe with plastic or rubber joints, \$24,834.83.

Asbestos cement sewer pipe with rubber ring joints, \$24,122.72.

Said estimates include engineering, attorney fees, supervision, advertising, clerical assistance and unforeseen contingencies.

Section III.

That the property lying within the boundaries hereinafter described, shall be and is hereby declared to be benefited by the construction and installation of said sewer system, to-wit:

Beginning at a point which lies south along the east line of Washburn Way a distance of 269.75 feet from the south line of Shasta Way; thence
