

Agents Stage Gaming Raid

PIERMONT, N.Y. (AP) — Agents of the State Investigation Commission and other officers bagged 45 well-heeled men in a gambling raid here Wednesday night.

Several expensive cars—including a Rolls Royce—were parked outside the raided building.

Commission Chairman Jacob Grumet said at his New York City home: "We cooperated with the Rockland County district attorney because we believe this (gambling) organization extends beyond Rockland County. This raid was part of our fight against organized crime."

Sheriff J. Henry Moch said: "This was nothing like the Apalachin convention."

Sixty-odd underworld figures and associates were picked up by state troopers who raided a mansion at Apalachin, a tiny upstate New York community, Nov. 14, 1957. All were released after questioning because, state police said, there were no grounds to arrest them. The State Investigation Commission and several other agencies are still trying to learn the purpose of that convention.

Wednesday night's raid was on Hudson River commuter community, 20 miles north of Times Square, across from populous northern New Jersey.

Moch said most of those seized were from New York City and New Jersey.

All the men were taken to the office of Dist. Atty. John A. Skahan at New City, the county seat.

In addition to three investigators and three lawyers of the State Investigation Commission, the raiding party included the sheriff, the district attorney, state troopers and Rockland County officers.

Moch said the raid followed weeks of surveillance of the gamblers.

Blood Saves Portland Boy

HONOLULU (UPI) — Seven-year-old Richard C. Nagler, son of Lt. Cmdr. and Mrs. Gordon Nagler of Portland, Ore., lives today because of voluntary blood donors responded to an emergency request for rare O-negative blood.

Richard was admitted to Tripler Army Hospital Feb. 18, suffering from hemophilia, a blood disorder characterized by excessive bleeding from a slight injury and sometimes no injury at all.

He has required a daily blood transfusion since March 7 of about a pint a day. The blood needed is of a very rare type.

The hospital's supply of O-negative blood ran short Wednesday, necessitating an emergency request for donors by the blood bank of Hawaii.

Five minutes after the request was broadcast over the air, calls flooded the blood bank with offers of that type of blood. Forty donors kept the blood bank staff members working almost four hours overtime. The bank planned to reopen at 8 a.m. today to receive more calls.

A hospital spokesman said it could not be determined for how long the boy will need daily transfusions. But since the type of blood the boy needs is so rare, the bank wants to build up a reserve for future use.

The boy's father works at the headquarters of the commander in chief of the Pacific Fleet. The Naglers have lived in Hawaii three years.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Two boys accused of attempted bank robbery stood awed and contrite before Juvenile Court Judge Melvin J. Cronin.

He looked sternly at Dan McKay, 9, and Danny Husk, 13, and asked where they got the idea.

"From television," stammered the boys.

Judge Cronin scolded them, lectured the parents and sent them home Wednesday. Little Dan and Danny had spent the night in Youth Guidance Center after their arrest Tuesday.

They admitted going to the Bank of America's Mission branch and presenting a note demanding \$100 under threat to "blow up the bank." The teller, Miss Filamene Miller, shooed them away and told the manager.

He called police, who staked out the boys' homes and arrested them after their return from a movie.

Little Dan and Danny said they had only wanted to replenish their supply of a play money issued by a bank as a promotion.

However, they cooked up the holdup note idea before entering the bank. Whether inspired by television or not, most bank holdups here follow the same pattern.

75,000 Died From Cancer

NEW YORK (AP) — Cancer kills 75,000 Americans each year—needlessly.

The American Cancer Society reported Tuesday that 45,000 Americans develop cancer each year.

Last year 150,000 were saved. The report said 75,000 more would have been saved by earlier diagnosis and treatment.

The two most rapidly increasing forms of cancer in older persons are leukemia (cancer of the blood) and lung cancer.

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Real Estate Free On Bail

WILMINGTON, Del. (AP) — Francis A. Levering, Jr., a real estate dealer who sold a Negro family a home in all-white Collins Park is free on bail on an assault charge.

Pearl Osterbo told magistrate August F. Umbrecht Tuesday, Levering threw a flower pot at her Monday night but missed. The flower pot broke in the road in front of Levering's home.

A number of residents from the suburban Collins Park have been assembling almost nightly in front of Levering's home and office since he sold the house to the Negro family.

Magistrate Umbrecht held Levering in \$300 bail on a charge of assault with intent to commit bodily harm and in \$50 bail on a charge of littering the highway.

HST Birthplace Dedication Set

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — The frame house in nearby Lamar where former President Harry Truman was born will be dedicated as a public memorial April 19.

It was purchased several years ago by the United Auto Workers, which will turn it over to the Missouri Park Board.

Walter Reuther, president of the UAW, will make the presentation. Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.) will be the principal speaker. Truman will attend the ceremony, set for 4 p.m., the approximate hour of his birth. He will be 75 years old May 8.

Life On Tropical Island Does Have Its Drawbacks

GERHALA ISLAND, Sulu Sea (AP) — How would you like to live six months on a tropical island complete with a comfortable cabin, radio and refrigerator and your own white beach at the doorway?

Four U.S. airmen here aren't exactly overjoyed.

Among the drawbacks are poisonous snakes and giant lizards. An abandoned leper colony is nearby. But the airmen say the worst thing is monotony and loneliness.

"I've come to the conclusion you can take this exotic stuff and give it to somebody else," said S. Sgt. John C. Coleman, 26, of Towanda, Penn. "I've had my fill of just basking in the sun."

"We have a life of boredom and waiting to go home," echoed S. Sgt. H. O. Jones, 27, of Cairo, Ga., dressed in the uniform of the day—a bath towel around the waist.

Coleman and Jones are stationed for six months on this British island four miles off Sandakan, North Borneo, with Airman I.C. David Pair, 23, (Route A) Double Springs, Ala., and S. Sgt. John R. Overstreet, 29, (Route 1) Durant, Okla.

They belong to the 1370th Aerial Photomapping Group in the Philippines and are not permitted to discuss their mission. Sources in Sandakan say they are manning a ground locator station in a U.S. Air Force project connecting surveys of Borneo and the Philippines to produce the great accuracy needed for missile-age maps.

Every few days, the men are called on their radio to operate equipment atop a hill from which they can see both Borneo and the Philippines Sulu Archipelago.

Otherwise, it's a life of playing cards, cooking the food brought in monthly by a Navy ship, boating, swimming and fishing.

"We travel but haven't caught a thing yet," said Coleman.

The Americans discovered after they arrived Dec. 15 that Gerhala is the site of a leprosarium. In World War II the Japanese had a prison camp here.

A few weeks after the airmen got in, authorities burned buildings of the former North Borneo Leprosarium near their cabin.

Big day of the week is Monday, when the airmen climb aboard a lighthouse keeper's boat for their four-mile journey to Sandakan.

Youth Enjoys Being Burglar

SEATTLE (AP) — "If I had \$100,000, I'd still pull burglaries," a sailboat-faced youth said Tuesday as he told how he burgled more than 100 Seattle homes after throwing rocks through the windows.

"It just sort of came natural. I used to like to throw baseballs," Walter E. Kinell, 22, told newsmen and police.

"I get a big thrill out of it," he said. "I like the stealth and the dark. I could easily be 160 places."

Kinell was arrested last November and admitted 103 burglaries. Because he had no prior record, sentencing was deferred for three years.

Kinell was arrested Monday night after a burglary which followed his pattern.
