Cabinet Aide Slates Talk

PORTLAND—Under Secretary of the Interior Elmer F. Bennett will make a major government policy statement concerning O & C timber lands when he addresses the Western Forest Industries Association convention Friday, April 3.

In the first major address on O & C management ever made by an official of the under secretary's rank in Oregon, Bennett is expected to announce new allowable cuts, timber selling goals, and other policy changes which will have far-reaching effects on Oregon forest industries.

Another guest at the convention will be Robert Wolf, forest consultant to the U.S. Senate Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs. Wolf will comment on his recently completed report on U.S. Forest Service timber selling practices.

The WFLA convention begins with a social get-together at 9 p.m. Thursday, and concludes with a dinner dance Saturday evening. All business and social sessions will be held at the Multnomah Hotel, with the exception of a luncheon for the ladies, Friday at Nendel's.

Tibetan Revolt May Alter India's Foreign Policy

NEW DELHI (UPI) — The revolt in Tibet plunged relations between India and Communist China to an all time low today. It may lead to a major shift in Indian foreign policy.

The Indians were deeply concerned and worried by the Communist oppression in Tibet and bitter about official Peiping charges the rebels are operating from headquarters at Kalimpong on Indian soil.

There also was resentment against the Communist suggestion that Tibetan matters should not even be discussed in the Indian parliament. Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru was expected to answer in Parliament today.

The Indian public and press were voicing increasingly strong demands for condemnation of the Chinese Communist action in Tibet and for a realistic reassessment of India's neutralist foreign policy.

The Hindustan Times, which is very close to Nehru's ruling Congress Party, referred to events there today as "the rape of Tibet."

Whereabouts of the Dalai Lama still was not known, but a reliable Indian report from Kalimpong on the Indo-Chinese border said he and 40,000 of his followers were moving south and eastward toward the Indian border and might seek asylum in India.

One unconfirmed report said the 23-year-old god-king was seriously injured in a fall while fleeing from Lhasa.

Voters Okay Tax Levies

ALBANY, Ore. (AP) — Albany voters Monday approved tax levies for swimming pool repairs and a mosquito control program.

But they rejected other proposed levies for a recreation program and a road improvement project.

The vote was 1,037 yes and 642 no on a special levy to provide \$2,700 for repairs to the city's swimming pool.

Also approved — 1,186 to 504 — was a \$4,200 five-year levy to finance mosquito control.

The voters turned down a 10-year, \$20,000 annual tax to finance a city park and recreation program. The vote was 899 no and 738 yes.

They also turned down, 832 to 766, a \$10,000 levy for the city's share of improvement of the intersection of Highways 99 and 20 at Albany. The state would have contributed \$105,000 to the project.

SALEM (AP) — Legislation to establish a graduate school of social work in the state System of Higher Education was approved Monday by the Senate Education Committee.

The committee recommended that the measure be sent to the Joint Ways and Means Committee.

It would require an appropriation of about \$25,000 to make plans for the school, which would open in the fall of 1961.

Governor Lands Negotiators

SALEM (AP)—Gov. Mark Hatfield Monday praised the participants in negotiations to avert a strike of pile drivers and carpenters which threatened to tie up major construction projects.

Hatfield, who held talks with the unions and the Association of General Contractors, said the negotiations have "avoided a damaging strike until the voice of the individual union member is heard."

The carpenters and pile drivers have submitted the latest offer to the members.

Mate Snips TV Actress

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Actress Vivian Vance, 45, who plays the strong-minded wife as Ethel in TV's "I Love Lucy," is described as a cruel wife in real life by actor Philip N. Ober, 50.

Ober sued for divorce Monday, declaring Miss Vance has treated him in a cruel and inhuman manner and caused him great mental anguish.

The couple married Aug. 18, 1941, at Marblehead, Mass., and separated last Feb. 6.

Ober asked the court to divide more than \$160,000 worth of community property.

Cons Facing Discipline

NAHUNTA, Ga. (AP) — Three convicts face disciplinary action at the Ware County prison branch after a spectacular attempt to escape with 12 others aboard a prison bus.

Warden A. W. Clay said the 12 men in the bus were forced to take part in the wild dash for freedom Monday and that no action would be taken against them. All 15 are white.

Clay identified the trio as: Tommy Bartfield, 25, of Walker County, serving 1 to 2 years for burglary; Jimmy Darnell, 18, of Clayton County, serving 5 to 10 years for burglary; and Dewitt Boyett, 20, of Charlton County, serving 1 to 4 years for larceny.

They were captured after they abandoned the bus and fled into a swampland. Bloodhounds finally led a posse to where the three convicts were hiding under a bridge. The men were armed with a shotgun and two pistols but surrendered meekly.

Other officers found the other 12 prisoners sitting quietly aboard the bus.

Navy Begins Test Series In Submarine Research

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP) — A weird-looking "water balloon" will begin a series of dives in about two weeks that eventually may take it into ocean depths man has never seen before.

The bathyscaphe Trieste, recently purchased by the Navy for \$200,000 from designer Auguste Piccard, already has descended nearly 12,000 feet in the Mediterranean. With changes now being made, it will be capable of diving into the Pacific's deepest trenches—almost seven miles below the surface.

The Trieste took two short dives off San Diego in December. Observers said the bathyscaphe experiment is the Navy's first big move in developing deep-water submarines. Today's subs cannot operate much below 750 feet, yet 90 per cent of the ocean lies beyond that level.

On April 4 Piccard's son Jacques will arrive at the Navy Electronics Laboratory here to act as consultant in the Trieste's new adventures.

By April 10 the Trieste is expected to be ready for launching again and three days later is scheduled to begin a two-month program of dives that will take it down to 4,000 feet. That's as deep as nearby coastal waters go.

Late this summer a mother ship will carry the Trieste to Hawaii for dives that will equal or better her old record of 12,000 feet.

The bathyscaphe is designed to carry two men, in a six-foot sphere suspended below a 50-foot-long tank which bears a stubby resemblance to a conventional submarine.

Solons Mull Integration

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — Virginia's General Assembly begins consideration today of new legal lines of defense against the spread of racial integration in public schools.

It appeared the program the Assembly will be asked to enact will add up to a freedom-of-choice plan as successor to the now-defunct massive resistance program which collapsed in state and federal courts.

The phrase "freedom of choice," said a source close to Gov. J. Lindsay Almond Jr., was chosen because the plan may offer a community or an individual the choice between state-aided private schooling or integrated public schooling.

A 40-member legislative commission has kept its deliberations secret. The assembly meeting is a resumption of the special school session of January 20 called after the court invalidated laws which had held the school segregation line since the Supreme Court's 1954 decision on the subject.

Legislators enacted two major requests Almond made — state tuition grants of up to \$250 for pupils who refused to attend integrated schools, and repeal of the compulsory school attendance law.

The Assembly then recessed and Almond named the commission to draft a new school program.

Dulles, 71, is staying at the home of Under Secretary of State C. Douglas Dillon, 20 miles from West Palm Beach.

Dulles arrived Monday. He said he felt "pretty good" as he left Washington in the presidential plane Columbine III.

Lincoln White, State Department press officer, said at Washington he understands Dulles will decide in Florida whether he feels well enough to step once again into the job as this country's foreign policy chief.

Dulles will not return to Washington for further medical tests, White said. Capt. Edward J. Kamin II, an Army internal medicine specialist, accompanied Dulles here with Mrs. Dulles.
