

Art Wall Garners Azalea Tournament

WILMINGTON, N. C. (AP) — Art Wall, a serious student of golf, tempered his enthusiasm over pocketing \$2,000 first money in the \$15,000 Azalea open tournament Monday with the observation that he hadn't played exceptionally well in the final round.

He had finished with a one-over-par 73 that gave him a 282 total, six under par, and a three-stroke margin over Mike Souchak, his ex-teammate on the Duke University golf squad.

Reminded that he has gone over par only seven times in 44 rounds of the 35-year-old Wall, who plays out of Pocono Manor, Pa., noted that five of his seven ventures over regulation figures have come in the final round.

"I can't understand that," he said. "I figure I'm as good a chaser as the finish as anyone. I'd prefer going into the Masters at Augusta Thursday off a good closing round."

Wall, in winning his second tournament this year, ran his earnings since the first of the year to just under \$19,000. That's more than any pro has ever picked up going into the Masters.

After his shaky front nine on his last tour of the 6,800-yard Cape Fear Country Club course, he settled down to an incoming 35, one under par. He made eight pars and a birdie, his only one of the day, on the home trip.

Wall, enjoying his greatest year as a pro, moved past Don Finsterwald of Tequesta, Fla., in the race to lead the Ryder-Cup team selections.

He now is a point ahead of Finsterwald, who shot the best score

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Pro Clubs Exercise Rights

CINCINNATI (AP) — The eight National Basketball Assn. members dipped into the ranks of college seniors today and each hoped to come up with another Bob Pettit, Bob Cousy, Bill Russell or Elgin Baylor.

The occasion was the annual player draft meeting which will give each club exclusive rights to bargain with probably 12 to 13 collegians who will be graduated this spring.

Whether they get their names on a contract is another matter and whether they'll make the grade in the tough NBA is still another. Seventeen of the rookies drafted last year made the grade, with Minneapolis' Lakers getting the prize in Baylor.

Several clubs, including the Philadelphia Warriors, were expected to exercise their territorial rights to players. Such clubs can claim a player from a school within a 50-mile radius but, by doing so, they relinquish their first choice in the regular draft.

Four years ago the Warriors claimed the fabulous Wilt Chamberlain out of high school under a draft rule which since has been abandoned. Now that Chamberlain's Kansas University class is graduating, Ed Gottlieb said they definitely would claim him.

Then it will be up to the Warriors to woo him away from the Harlem Globetrotters with whom he now is playing. Chamberlain gave up his last year of college eligibility to join the Globetrotters.

The Detroit Pistons and the St. Louis Hawks are among others who may exercise territorial rights. St. Louis has coveted eyes on Bob Ferry of St. Louis University and Detroit on John Green of Michigan State and M. C. Burton of Cincinnati.

After territorial choices, the Cincinnati Royals will have first choice since they had the poorest record during the past season.

Portland Nine Evens Record
BRAWLEY, Calif. (AP) — The Portland Beavers are even with five victories and five losses in exhibition baseball games.

The Portland club's 5-4 victory over Seattle Monday equalized the Beavers' won-lost record.

The loss was charged to Seattle Southpaw Bill Kennedy. Dave Gray, who went in the ninth and pitched a scoreless inning, was credited with the victory.

The Beavers collected 11 hits off two Seattle pitchers. Portland's three hurlers gave up six runs total and I would have had 25 or 27. That's a lot more respectable than 15."

Earl Robinson Sent To St. Paul
VERO BEACH, Fla. (UPI) — The Los Angeles Dodgers reduced their roster to 33 players today by optioning pitcher Rene Valdes to Montreal and pitcher Earl Robinson and Gene Wallace to St. Paul.

Robinson, the ace of the Dodgers bullpen when he posted an 8 to 2 record and 2.72 earned run average in 1957, has been plagued by a sore arm since early last season. He was on the voluntary retired list during most of 1958.

If his arm fails to respond, Robinson will be given a trial at first base at St. Paul.

Valdes had a 15 to 14 record at Montreal last year. He appeared in five Dodgers games this spring, allowing three runs and six hits in 7 1/3 innings.

Wallace and Robinson were with Green Bay (Three-I) last year. Wallace, a shortstop, hit .291. Robinson, a third baseman, hit .254. Monday, the Dodgers sent pitchers Roger Craig and Bob Giamberini and outfielder Don Miles to Spokane.
