Feds Arrest Dope Suspect

NEW YORK (AP)—Federal narcotics agents have arrested John (Big John) Ormento, a delegate to the Apalachin gangland convention and described by authorities as "one of the biggest importers and distributors" of narcotics in the United States.

Ormento, 45, formerly of Lido Beach, N.Y., was one of 36 men indicted last July with reputed gangland kingpin Vito Genovese in what the government described as a crackdown on the nation's top narcotics ring.

He was arrested Monday night along with Nick Tolentino. Both were long-sought narcotics conspiracy suspects. Ormento was on the Federal Narcotics Bureau "most wanted" list.

Ormento appeared before a New York legislative committee in December 1957 and invoked the Fifth Amendment nine times in refusing to answer questions about a meeting at the home of Joseph Barbara Sr., on Nov. 14, 1957, at Apalachin, N.Y. The meeting was said by police to have been a gathering of major figures of the

underworld and their associates. The arrests came amid speculation over the reported disappearance of another delegate to the Apalachin meeting, multimillionaire Vincent Rao.

The New York Daily News speculated that Rao, a power in East Harlem with many interests, may have been slain because he knew too much.

The fine print of the 308-page appropriations bill laid before the House today includes a provision that State Highway Department cars may not have eight cylinders, automatic transmissions or air conditioning.
