Black Hawks, Leafs Take Favored Rolls

The injury list seems to be playing the biggest part in a deadlocked Stanley Cup semifinal series, thanks to the rough play of the two supposed "easy marks."

The Chicago Black Hawks and Toronto Maple Leafs have taken the favored Montreal Canadiens and Boston Bruins back to the latter's home bases with the best of seven series tied at two-all after Tuesday night's victories.

The Hawks laced the Canadiens 5-1 in Chicago and Toronto delighted to home folks with a thrilling 3-2 overtime victory over Boston.

Both games were characterized by the body-numbing checking and sleek skating that jolted the Canadiens and Bruins last Saturday.

The two clubs still were feeling the effects, Montreal was not the same club that scoured the National Hockey League during the regular season without Jean Beliveau, a doubtful participant no matter if the Canadiens make the Stanley Cup finals.

A jarring check by Glen Skov Saturday fractured two vertebrae and forced Canadiens' Coach Toe Blake to move Henri Richard out of Beliveau's spot on Montreal's high-scoring line with Dickie Moore and Marcel Bonin, weakening his second line.

Lorne Ferguson's 29-foot shot at 6:34 of the third period broke a 1-1 tie and the insurance marker came in the last minute as Chicago fired one into an unprotected Montreal goal.

Boston played without hard-charging defenseman Doug Mohns, who also was injured last Saturday.

But the Leafs heaped their credit on left-winger Frank Mahovlich, who scored the winning goal at 11:21 of a sudden-death period.
