Navy Seeking Former Tars

The U.S. Navy is plunking for ex-Navy men to rejoin the ranks. The Portland recruiting station issued word that men who reenlist within 90 days after discharge will reap a generous bonus and continuous service with no reduction in pay.

They are allowed to collect the bonus and an advance travel allowance and take up to 30 days' leave in advance of reporting for duty.

The recruiting station reports that it will work hard to get appointments to schools chosen for attendance by reenlistees.

Men who have served six years have completed one fourth of the span necessary for retirement at full pension.

The average pension plan yields \$68,000 when it matures, according to recruiting office statements.

Recruits Sought By Air Force

The Air Force is looking for pilots and navigator recruits between the ages of 19 and 25½ years old.

Recruits must be single and graduates of high school. They must present diplomas from accredited high schools when they apply for Aviation Cadet training.

Trainees will receive lieutenant rank when they complete flight training.
