

Boys' Camp Chief Named

TULELAKE — Elmer Rund, 49, a 1949 homesteader, and Tulelake judicial judge in Modoc County has been appointed superintendent of Northern California's first inter-county camp for delinquent boys which will open within a month to initial contingent of youths from Yola, Colusa and Solana counties. He will be headquartered at Woodland.

Rund, who will report April 1, will be joined at the end of the present school year by Mrs. Rund who will serve as an assistant on his staff, and by their two children, Margaret, 16, and Eric, 12.

Rund is assuming his new duties with knowledge of the program, having served at one time as a counselor at Los Prietos Boys Camp, served jointly by Santa Barbara and Ventura counties.

During his residence here he has been a member of Tulelake Post, No. 164, American Legion, VFW Post, Vortex 229 40 and 4, Klamath Falls, Klamath Falls Lodge, No. 1247 BPOEiks and the PTA in addition to his judicial duties and ranching. The family home is 10 miles south of Tulelake on State Highway 139.

The judgeship which Rund is leaving will be declared vacant. Modoc County supervisors will call for a judicial council and a qualifying examination will be given of applicants.
