Miracle Cherry Pie

Late winter and early spring are in-between-times for menus. A beautiful cherry pie for dessert will pep up any dinner and the fact that it can be prepared in a few minutes adds to its appeal.

MIRACLE CHERRY PIE
1 1/2 cups (17-ounce can) pitted canned unsweetened red cherries, drained

1 1/4 cups water and cherry juice combined
1 package vanilla pudding and pie filling
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup sugar
2 teaspoons lemon juice
1 tablespoon butter
Few drops red food coloring
1 baked 8-inch pie shell, cooled

Combine cherries and 1/4 cup of the combined water and cherry juice in a saucepan. Bring to a boil. Meanwhile, combine pudding mix, salt, sugar, lemon juice, and remaining 1/4 cup liquid. Stir to form a smooth paste. Add to boiling fruit, stirring to blend. Then cook and stir until mixture comes to a full boil.

Remove from heat. Add butter and food coloring. Cool 5 minutes. Pour into pie shell. Let stand about 3 hours, or until firm. Serve with sweetened whipped cream, if desired.

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HOME MADE BREAD

Fathers Day is almost here. And what better way to pamper him on his day than turning out a batch of home-made bread. If he has a sweet tooth, add a spiral of cinnamon and a sugar icing for a loaf that will not only delight in flavor but heady aroma which will proclaim its baking throughout the house. Father will not only appreciate it, he is sure to be voluble in his praise.

CINNAMON LOAF

1 cup milk
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/4 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 package or cake yeast, active dry or compressed
1/2 cup warm, not hot, water (lukewarm for compressed yeast)

1 egg, beaten
4 1/2 cups sifted enriched flour
Melted butter or margarine
1/4 cup sugar
1 tablespoon cinnamon

Scald milk. Add butter, 1/4 cup sugar and salt and stir to blend. Cool to lukewarm. Measure water into a mixing bowl (warm, not hot, water for active dry yeast). Sprinkle or crumble in yeast. Stir until dissolved. Add lukewarm milk mixture. Add and stir in egg, then flour. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface. Knead until smooth and elastic. Place dough in greased bowl. Brush top lightly with melted shortening. Cover with cloth. Let rise in warm

place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 45 minutes. Roll each half into an oblong about 8 inches x 10 inches. Brush each lightly with melted butter or margarine. Mix together 1/2 cup sugar and cinnamon. Sprinkle half of mixture on each oblong of dough. Roll up each piece tightly crosswise as for jelly roll. Place in greased bread pans 9 x 5 x 3 inches. Let rise in warm place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 65 minutes. Bake at 350 degrees (moderate oven) about 40 minutes. Ice top while hot with Plain Icing. Makes 2 loaves.

PLAIN ICING

1/2 cup sifted confectioners' sugar
2 teaspoons milk
1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
Combine all ingredients and beat until smooth.
