U.S. Youth Said 'Soft'

PORTLAND (AP) — America's youth grows soft while the communist nations raise children with muscle. Avery Brundage, chairman of the International Olympic Committee, said Tuesday.

"The kids in this country think they have to ride a bus to school if they live more than two blocks away," Brundage said in an interview. Brundage added, "They spend their leisure time watching the television set. They rarely participate in a sport. They would rather watch others play."

In contrast, Russia and the rest of the communist nations are developing kids with some muscle. Brundage was asked how the physical condition of America's youth could be improved. Brundage said he will discuss that in a speech today to the American Assn. of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

Another leading Olympic Games figure, the Rev. Bob Richards, a pole vaulting champion, also is scheduled to speak at the convention enters its third day today. 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Ike Signs Bill To Remedy Error

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower Tuesday signed a bill to correct a 40-year mistake in time.

The bill authorized payment of \$9,393 to Ellis Timber Co. of Portland, Ore.

A congressional committee report said that the firm contracted to buy salvage timber believed killed in a 1906 fire.

After logging began, the report said, it was learned that the timber was killed in an 1896 blaze. Because of the 40-year difference in time, the trees had more decay than believed originally.

LAUSANNE, Switzerland (UPI) — Dr. James A. Lehman told United Press International today he will operate on Princess Grace of Monaco "sometime this week."

He refused to say, however, whether the former Hollywood movie star was suffering more than a recurrent appendicitis.

The Philadelphia surgeon, who is the Kelly family physician, confirmed earlier reports that he had been corresponding with Lausanne surgeon Dr. Jean - David Buffat about the princess' condition for some months.

Told that medical circles here believed that it is unusual to allow a recurrent appendicitis to go so long without an operation, Lehman said: "That's a technical point."

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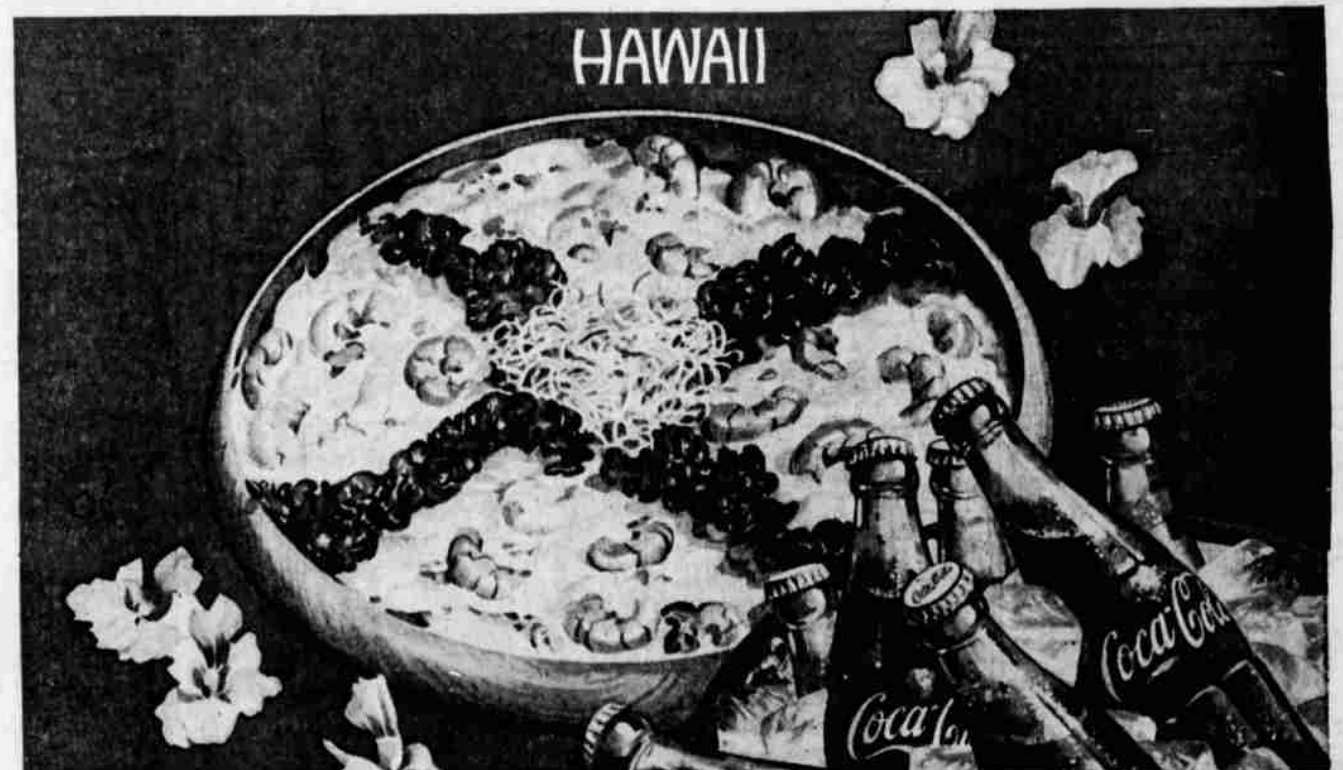
